Vote Close in 1st Kings Official Count Reveals

GEORGETOWN—Official declaration day proceedings conducted in Georgetown yesterday by Kings County returning officer Henry Mallard saw the margin of victory of Liberal Daniel J. Macdonald over Hon. Melvin McQuaid in First Kings reduced to 12 votes from the 49 reported unofficially election night.

In the same district, Hon. John A. Aldin MacKenzie was reduced by one vote to 25 over William Acorn, Liberal for the Assemblyman's seat.

Whether there will be recounts in this district has not been determined yet. Mr. Macdonald's total vote is 57 and Mr. McQuaid's is 95. Mr. Macdonald polled 1,167 votes while Mr. Acorn had 1,142.

In Second Kings, Hon. Leo F. Rossier's total for councillor was 883 while J.W. Trainor, Liberal, had 892. P.C. J. Walter Dingwall polled 1,044 while Liberal J. Aldin MacKenzie had 774 for assemblyman.

In Third Kings, Conservative Douglas McGowan had 854 for councillor, Thomas Curran, P.C., Liberal, had 854 for the assemblyman's seat.

In Fourth Kings, the vote for councillor for all candidates remained the same as reported on election night. Liberal Leader Albert D. Macdonald polled 1,337 votes for councillor to William White, Liberal, polled 1,357 votes for

assemblyman to PC Donald Craig's 759.

The result of the official declaration day count in Fifth Kings candidates the totals for all candidates but the results remained the same, both Liberal candidates won. George Ferguson's total increased to 759 while P.C. James C. Macdonnell dropped by 40 to 650. Liberal Arthur J. Macdonald's total for assemblyman increased to 888 while P.C. Paul Macdonald's total dropped to 770. Mr. Ferguson's majority thus is 169 and 29 as reported election night and Arthur Macdonald's majority is 118 instead of 69.

St. Laurent police brought early Monday to give their impressions of the men's appearance to a police artist, who was making drawings to guide police in their search.

Among witnesses are a motel man believed to be one of the robbers come to the motel and call for a taxi; a truck driver who gave the same man a lift to Dorval, west of Montreal, and a taxi-driver who drove the man back to Montreal, directly past the murder scene.

A total of \$64,000 worth of negotiable, unregistered bonds taken in the robbery has been recovered. Still missing is \$6,500 in cash and \$56,000 worth of U.S. and Canadian traveller's cheques.

Originally, the loot had been announced as \$20,000 cash and \$10,000 in bonds.

A 32-year-old Montreal man was questioned and released by St. Laurent and provincial police Sunday. He came into the police station with a lawyer after hearing that police had wanted to question him in connection with the shootings.

He said he was afraid of the police order to "shoot to kill" in the case and decided to clear himself. Police said they were satisfied he had nothing to do with the case.

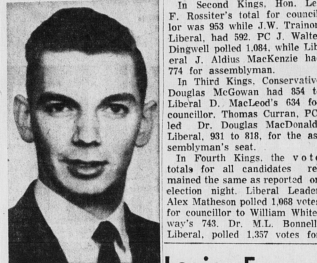

Hundreds Seek Food Plant Work

Hundreds of letters have poured in to Industry and Natural Resources Minister Leo Rossiter from potential employees and growers in Kings County for work with the Fraser Valley Frosted Foods Company Limited food processing plant to be built in Montague. They are "All letters will be acknowledged," said Mr. Rossiter, "and the applications will be compiled, classified, and sent to the company's head office."

He said that early next year the company will be sending field men to Kings County to work with prospective growers in lining up crops for next season.

It is expected that the million-dollar plant, to be built and equipped by the government and operated on a lease-purchase arrangement by the company, will be in operation in August.

Monaco Gives Women Vote

MONTE CARLO, Monaco (Reuters)—Prince Rainier proclaimed a new and more liberal constitution for his pocket principality Monday, under which women get the right to vote and run for the National Council, Monaco's parliament.

The 97-article constitution recently got the council's approval in principle. A key clause in the new constitution is that it cannot be suspended.

In 1920 Rainier suspended the old constitution, in force since 1911. He also dissolved the parliament after it tried to vote and force him to give it more power.

The prince took supreme control, later nominating 12 member bodies to take over the duties of the elected parliament. But last March he restored the constitution, re-established the elected parliament and promised that women would get the vote.

Monaco has about 3,500 citizens.

Vessel Loads At Murray H.

MURRAY HARBOR — The M. Inavision, under Captain W. Warham of Harbor Buffett, Nfld., is expected to clear port at Murray Harbor today after 1000 on produce for Newfoundland Ports. She is being loaded by Lea and MacFarlane.

It is thought to be the largest sailing from this port. A ship loaded by Chesel Irving departed last year on Dec. 15.

Knowles Fails To Introduce Employment Bill

OTTAWA (CP) — Stanley Knowles (NDP — St. North Centre) proposed in the Commons Monday a new piece of legislation that would contain, among other things, a clear-cut recognition of the importance of "full" employment as national policy.

Herb Gray, a New West backed the bill. He said the former Liberal government in a 1946 white paper spelled out full employment as a goal to do that, again.

However, both P.C. Progressive Conservative and Social Credit MPs opposed Mr. Knowles' resolution asking the government to consider introducing what he called "the Canada Full Employment Act." Debating time closed without a vote being taken.

Robert Muir (PC—Cape Breton North) said the proposed bill would be "window dressing." He doubted whether anything could be achieved by a piece of "legislative wishful thinking" that would "not provide one thing, the job for one single man."

Mr. Knowles' resolution said the bill should include a declaration of federal responsibility for full employment; the economic advisers; and an annual report to Parliament on the progress of the act, as well as the purpose of the act, were being fulfilled.

Robert McCleave (PC—Hull) said a similar proposal had been offered several years ago at a Canadian Labor Congress convened by economist Dr. Eugene Forsey who said it would lead to a lineup for jobs that would stretch from every MP's office to the St. Lawrence River.
