And Treasury Secretary Douglas Dillon disclosed that under-withholding of U.S. income taxes last year probably totaled less than \$500,000,000 as had been assumed earlier. TORONTO (CP)—Prices were higher in moderate stock exchange trading Tuesday. Steel stocks, spurred by Steelco's announcement Monday that it has increased prices of its bar-rolled products, led the advance. Trading in the group was moderate to heavy. Steelco raised 1/2 to 25 1/2 and traded 17 1/2. Algoma was up 18,207 shares. Algoma was unchanged at 77 1/2 and Dofasco rose 1/2 to 17 1/2. Bell Telephone gained 1/2 to 62 1/2 and Moore Corp. Royal Bank and Trans-Canada Pipe 1/2 each to 62 1/2, 80 1/2 and 39. Canadian Tire rose a point to 49 and the A issue 3/4 to 47 1/2. Bank of Nova Scotia was ahead 1/2 to 83 and Canada Iron Foundries rose a point to 47. Canadian General Electric jumped 6 1/2 to 58 1/2 in light trade. Noranda sparked senior metals with a 1/2 rise to 55 1/2. Denison rose 1/2 to 28. The firm has a big uranium sale in the works. Cominco gained 1/2 to 46 1/2. In speculative, Teck rose 3 cents to \$1.43 and Raglan 5 cents to \$1.70. Each traded heavily. In golds, Dome dropped 1/2 to 22 1/2 and Campbell Red Lake 1/2 to 22 1/2. Home B fell 1/2 to 21 among oils and Calgary and Edmonton rose 1/2 to 20 1/2. On index, industrials rose 45 to 171.56. The Toronto Stock Exchange index 46 to 160.98, golds 1.20 to 167.71, base metals 46 to 81.18 and western oils 30 to 98.77. Volume was a 3,908,000 shares compared with 3,178,000 shares traded Monday.

### ALOOF ROLE FOR CANADA IS SUGGESTED

MONTREAL (CP) — Canadian should keep aloof over events in Viet Nam, John W. Holmes, director-general of the Canadian Institute of International Affairs, said here. Mr. Holmes said in an interview that "of course there will have to be negotiations" on Viet Nam. But he saw little the Canadian members of the International Control Commission could do. Earlier, in an address to the Canadian Club, Mr. Holmes said: "We must accept the fact that the United States, holding most of the defensive power of the West, is going to make unilateral such critical decisions as the blockade of Cuba or the bombing of North Viet Nam." Mr. Holmes said Canada must recognize realistically that the U.S. is the champion of the West. "The super-power upholding Western interests in the nuclear contest." "What the United States has a right to expect of us, I think, is that we should act as a partner and responsible ally and help to set an example to other allies," he said.

### CLIMBS MATTHEWSON

ZERMATT, Switzerland (Reuters)—Walter Bonatti, the Italian mountain-climbing ace, Monday became the first man ever to climb alone the steepest north face of the Matterhorn in the Swiss Alps. Mr. Bonatti was reported here. Bonatti's conquest of the 14,791-foot killer mountain was reported by a local guide who watched his ascent through binoculars.
