ONTREAL PRICES

For Butter, Cheese, Eggs and Pork Products.

(Montreal Star, 26.)

Butter—There does not appear to be any great amount of trade passing at present, largely because of the weather. Prices are pretty steady, but export sales have taken place since our last report at 23 1-4; for the finest quality boxes. It is thought that the market might be quoted as high at 23 1-2 for what is known as pet or fancy goods, inasmuch as 1-4c less has been realized for those which are not pets. Finest quality goods might be quoted at 22 3-4 to 23 or 24 1-2; western dairies, 17c to 18c for finest and 20c for finest Eastern Township dairies. Receipts reported on the Board of Trade this morning amounted to only 129 packages.

Cheese—Business was rather dull this morning. The public cable was 6d up, at 53s 6d and 55s, but the local market was fairly steady, with nothing unusual to note. The strong tendency continues, however, and if there is not actually a higher market, one may be expected as soon as the higher priced goods commence to arrive. Some quote westerns at 12 1/2 cents, but it is not reported that sales have taken place at that figure, and good goods can be readily picked up at 12 cents and even 1-8 to 1-4 lower. Quebec sold at 11 1/2 to 11 3/4 yesterday, so that Westerns should be cheap at 11 1/2 and 12 cents. Receipts reported on the Board of Trade this morning amounted to 12,172 cases.

Eggs—The English market appears at last to have come up to a figure at which it is profitable for Canadians to export. Shipping orders are numerous, not only for pickled, which are held here on contract, but for fresh as well. This commands an active demand for freight space, as the quantity of eggs in pickle is rather larger than usual, and there is not any too much time wherein to ship it. Production is said to be falling off, and this should have a strengthening influence upon the market. Local trade is active for good stock, and dull for other grades. Receipts, exclusive of those for export, this morning were 1,057 cases.

Prices quoted this morning were culls, 9 to 11 c; No 2, 12 1/2 to 13 1/2; straight gathered, 14 1/2 to 15; straight candied, 15 to 15 1/2; selects, 17 to 18c.

Canadian Pork—Barrels heavy short cut mess, \$16 50; short cut back family pork, \$15 50; barrels heavy short or long cut clear, \$15; barrels short cut clear, light, \$14 50; barrels heavy flack, \$14 50.

Lard—pure lard, in pails, 7c; compound in pails, 5 1/2 to 6c.

The Liverpool cable quoted lard and bacon from 31 to 6d higher today, other lines being steady, pork 5 1/2 to 3d; lard 2 1/2 to 6d to 2 1/2 to 3d; bacon 3 1/2 to 3 1/2 to 2 1/2 to 2 1/2.

CHARLOTTETOWN MARKETS.

The buyers are offering 27c per bushel for oats and for potatoes they offer 16c per bushel. The demand is not great and the quantities moving are small. Eggs are steady at 12 1/2, and the receipts are liberal for the time of year. Cheese is quoted at 11 1/2, with a fairly active market.

CONSERVATIVES ATTEND.—The Liberal-Conservative Convention to nominate a candidate for the Belfast district will be held at Eldon to-morrow at 11 o'clock. It is expressly desired that all supporters of the party attend.

DEDICATION SERVICE.—The chapel recently erected by Rev. Dr. Doyle, at China Point, for the benefit of his parishioners in that section will be solemnly opened for Divine worship on next Sunday, Oct. 1st. The service of dedication will begin at 10 o'clock, p. m.
