### AUSTRALIA.

#### Governors of the Commonwealth and the States.

LONDON, Nov. 19.—The London Gazette announces that the Queen has been pleased by letters patent bearing date the 29th October, 1900, to constitute the office of Governor-General and Commander-in-Chief of the Commonwealth of Australia, and by further letters patent, bearing the same date, respectively, to constitute the office of Governor in each of the six States of the said Commonwealth.

The appointments are as follows:—

The Right Honourable the Earl of Hopetoun, P. C., K. T., G. C. M. G., G. C. V. O., to be Governor-General and Commander-in-Chief of the Commonwealth of Australia.

The Right Hon. Earl Beauchamp, K. C. M. G., to be Governor of the State of New South Wales and its Dependencies.

The Right Hon. Lord Lamington, G. C. M. G., to be Governor of the State of Queensland and its Dependencies.

The Right Hon. Lord Tennyson, K. C. M. G., to be Governor of the State of South Australia and its Dependencies.

The Right Hon. Sir Samuel James Way, Bart., (Chief Justice of South Australia), to be Lieut.-Governor of the State of South Australia and its Dependencies.

The Hon. Sir Samuel Walker Griffith, G. C. M. G., (Chief Justice of Queensland), to be Lieut.-Governor of the State of Queensland and its Dependencies.

Sir Frederick Matthew Darley, K. C. M. G., (Chief Justice of New South Wales), to be Lieutenant-Governor of New South Wales and its dependencies.

Sir John Maddeu, K. C. M. G., (Chief Justice of Victoria) to be Lieut.-Governor of the State of Victoria and its dependencies.

### UNITED STATES SHIPPING.

#### Great Prosperity With Protection.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 19.—The report of Commissioner of Navigation Chamberlain, made public, says the past fiscal year has been the most prosperous period known to American shipping for some years. Returns for the current fiscal year promise an even more satisfactory record.

For the first time since the Civil War the documented tonnage of the United States exceeds 5,000,000 gross tons. On June 30th, 1900, American documented tonnage comprised 23,833 vessels of 5,164,833 gross tons, an increase of 300,000 tons over the previous fiscal year. Our maximum tonnage was 5,539,811 tons in 1861. Our shipping, the report adds, in 1861 was larger than Great Britain's and nearly equalled the British empires. British shipping now amounts to 14,261,000 gross tons.

American vessels are almost confined to the coasting trade, which employed last year 4,338,143 tons or more than the total tonnage of Germany and France. Our tonnage in the foreign trade was only 816,795 tons, and carried last year only 9 per cent. of our imports and exports.

### TURKISH MINISTERS IN WANT.

#### Unable to Return to Washington Unless Back Salary is Paid.

MOSCOW, Nov. 19.—A despatch from Constantinople says that the Turkish Minister to Washington is now in the Sultan's capital on leave of absence. His presence there is due to the fact that his salary has been unpaid, and he is in need of funds: so much so, in fact, that he is unable to return to America unless he can get the government to pay him.

The plague in Afghanistan is at the highest and worst pitch known. Hundreds are dying daily. Russia has declared quarantine against the country.

#### They Fear France.

HONG KONG, Nov. 19.—Chinese officials aver that a certain power has demanded leave to place troops on a hill overlooking Canton. No foreign authority confirms the assertion, but the Cantonese continue to fear French designs on the city.

### A DUTCH OPINION.

#### Continuation of the Boer Resistance a Senseless Enterprise.

LONDON, Nov. 19.—The Brussels correspondent of the Times says:—

"Professor Molengraaf, one of the highest authorities on South African affairs, who passed many years in Pretoria, and was a witness of all the recent events in South Africa, has now come back to his native town, Amsterdam. He characterizes the continuation of the Boer resistance as a senseless enterprise, and says that the independence of the Boer Republics is definitely lost. The guerilla war continued by disorganized bands of Boer marauders he describes as only calculated to cause needless bloodshed. Prof. Molengraaf gives high praise to Lord Roberts' strategy and the English army's bravery."

#### "SINS OF THE FATHERS."

#### Prince Tuan's Son Can Never Become Emperor.

LONDON, Nov. 19.—A news agency despatch from Shanghai, referring to the alleged new Imperial edict depriving Princess Tuan and Chwang of all rank and office and handing them over to the Imperial Clan Court for close confinement, pending further punishment of Prince Tuan means that his son, the heir apparent, can never be Emperor. The edict also makes the early opening of formal peace negotiations probable.

#### Wealthy Deserter.

LONDON, Nov. 19.—James Farlinger Thomson, of Ontario, was arrested on board the Cunard liner Campania at Queenstown yesterday morning just before she started on her westward voyage. He came to London last April on an excursion of England, Scotland and France, patronizing the best hotels. While in Glasgow he enlisted in the Royal Irish regiment, and he had been stationed at Clonet, but he deserted and took passage for the United States, Thomson, who is said to be very wealthy, is the son of a Canadian merchant. The police handed him over to the military authorities.

#### The Monticello Investigation.

HALIFAX, N. S., Nov. 19.—Captain W. H. Smith, Dominion wreck commissioner, Captain Bloomfield Douglas and Captain Spain left this morning for Yarmouth to commence an official enquiry there into the foundering of the steamer Monticello in the Bay of Fundy, by which thirty-six lives were lost. All the captains are Royal Naval Reserve officers. From Yarmouth the court will be removed later to St. John, the last port the Monticello left on her fatal trip, to obtain further evidence.

#### Grand Trunk Management.

MONTREAL, Nov. 19.—Geo. B. Reeves, who resigned as general traffic manager of the Grand Trunk in May last to retire in private life, has been appointed general manager of the system in succession to Chas. M. Hays, appointed president of the Southern Pacific railway. Mr. Reeves has accepted.
