## Old Parties Challenged To Debate On Issues

"High pressure politics, costing thousands of dollars per day, here on the island is the system being used by the two old parties to try to get elected," Leo McIsaac said last night at a rousing meeting at St. Stewart. "Who is supplying all this money for their campaigns?" he asked. "We are, the farmers, fishermen, wage earners and small business men of Canada. How? By the profits made from our products and efforts by the big companies who have economic control now, and who are getting more and more control, over our political organizations. "Let's not camouflage the local issues by talking about devaluation and developing the north. Our farmers and fishermen and wage earners are the basis of a prosperous island community. Their prosperity makes business good or poor. And to get our fair share of the consumers' dollar and give our families an equal start in life, primary producers must stand together," Mr. McIsaac continued. "Government handouts to the unemployed, or for little projects here and there is not an answer. We need an orderly system of marketing our products and a national plan to stimulate industry and employment," he said. ## Shopping Centre Details Are Given

Details of a proposed \$1,000,000 shopping centre for Charlottetown were revealed Wednesday in a brief presented to the town planning committee of City Council, on behalf of the Manovill Realty Corp. of Wheaton, Maryland. The brief, prepared by the owners' legal representative, F. A. Large, QC, asked the committee to consider rezoning an area of land in the city's north-west region for "light commercial use". The area at present is zoned as a residential area.

The president of the Manovill firm, Robert J. Manovill, who owns a 100-acre farm at Brackley where he spends the summer months, is "enthusiastically optimistic" over the economic future of Charlottetown and P.E.I., the brief said. "There are three main factors which influence his outlook: 1—The rapid growth of Prince Edward Island's tourist industry and the announcement of the construction of a causeway. 2—The scheduled construction of the Fathers of Confederation Memorial Building in downtown Charlottetown. 3—The change in buying habits of the consumer with regard to food products. Mr. Manovill feels, the brief said, that the tourist business will continue to expand and the

The brief said, if the area is rezoned, present plans call for construction to start in March of 1963, with the date of occupancy set for Aug. 1 of 1964. The brief pointed out that this new enterprise would probably create in excess of 50 new permanent jobs and with the development of housing projects in the area "a shopping centre would be appropriate and in addition to the present commercially-zoned ribbon development which has taken place and will no doubt fill up the west side of Elm Avenue and Malpas Road."
