WORLD HIT BLACKMAIL

The measure would carry out Eisenhower's plea for action against secondary boycotts and so-called blackmail picketing. Secondary boycotts consist of pressure by unions against neutral firms to prevent them doing business with other firms having labor trouble. Eisenhower said blackmail picketing has often been used against employers to force recognition of a union although there was no proof employees wanted certification.

NO RECORDS ALLOWED

Labor leaders would have to report any financial transactions that might constitute a conflict of interest. Persons convicted of major crimes would be barred from union office.

Election of international union officers would have to take place at least once in five years and for locals once in three years. Union members would have recourse to secret ballot in seeking the ouster of union officials accused of misconduct. Embezzlement of union funds would be subject to fines of up to \$10,000 and imprisonment for five years.

Meany in discussing the "code of rights" included in the legislation, said it would subject a union presiding officer to a two-year jail sentence merely for blocking a disorderly person from disrupting a union meeting.
