

# The Fights That Dast Result In Death Of Three Boxers

Championship fights of the last 12 years resulted in the deaths of three boxers. They are Benny Paret, the most recent victim, Walter Crook and Jimmy Doyle.

Paret was the only recognized champion to die after a bout. Crook died Dec. 8, 1937, of a heart ailment in a London fight with Jimmy Barry, which cleared up the disputed possession of the heavyweight title. Doyle died after a welterweight title fight with the champion, Maurice Rose, on June 24, 1947, in Cleveland.

There have been other prominent deaths, including Zsazszi Schaff and Frankie Campbell. Schaff died after he was knocked out at Madison Square Garden on Feb. 10, 1933, by Primo Carnera. Campbell was fatally injured in a bout against Max Baer on Aug. 25, 1936, in St. Francis.
