Parkdale H. & S. Hear Assistant Education Director

The monthly meeting of the Parkdale Home and School Association was held in the Parkdale Hall, Wednesday, March 21st at 8:30 with Mr. P. J. MacDonald presiding and 35 members present.

Following the minutes and treasurer's report the P.E.I. Federation news letter from Mrs. Lantz was read. It stressed that members should either hear or read Judge Pottier's address in April. Various program suggestions were also offered.

Chaperones for the April social of the Youth Club were requested. The parent attendance prize money was won by Mrs. Livingstone's class.

The President introduced the guest speaker, Mr. Malcolm MacKenzie, Assistant Director of Education whose topic "Text Books - A Most Enlightening To All Present." He explained the various systems used by the Provinces of Canada for supplying authorized texts to students. They are: rental costing the student \$3 to \$4 a year; free loan texts; texts subsidized by either the provincial government or local school boards or both. The provincial government subsidized text method is used in P.E.I. and means that the text books are sold to the students at approximately one third to one half the publisher's list price. Mr. MacKenzie explained the advantages and disadvantages of each system and felt parents should consider which system they preferred.

Following adjournment lunch was served.
