**Contract Bridge**

**NO FOLLOW-THROUGH**

West got off to a good lead in today's deal but his follow-up defense was woefully shortighted.

North dealer. Both sides vulnerable.

♥ A 5

The bidding:

North	East	South	West
1 ♠	Pass	1 ♠	Pass
Pass	Pass	3 NT	Pass

As will be seen at a glance, a low club lead by West, from his only four-card suit would have given the enemy nine quick tricks, and thus West deserved credit for actually leading the heart king. To repeat, however, he soon surrendered his advantage. Dummy's ace was played and East correctly followed suit with the heart ten. Declarer then made the bold bluff of leading the club king from dummy — with remarkable success! West took the trick and, apparently convinced that he had struck great heart length in part-

ner's hand, he laid down the queen and another heart. This, of course, was very pleasing to the declarer — with two heart tricks home, he could now run off the diamond suit for his contract.

West was much too impulsive in his continuation of hearts! In the first place, East's play of the heart ten had definitely denied the jack; under the circumstances involved here, if West had the J-10 etc. of hearts his play of the ten would be an outstanding error — he should play the jack.

In the second place, since West could certainly assume that dummy's diamonds were solid, he could also assume that the contract could not be defeated unless East had the spade ace, and therefore, after taking the club trick, West should have shifted to spades. The result of that shift is easy to see!
