Pioneers Defeat Red Sox 9-4 In Free-hitting Game

Four runs in the top of the ninth tucked away a game for the Pioneers at Summerside last evening by a 9-4 score. Up to this point the game was hard fought with the winners holding a two run advantage by the end of the fifth, increased to four in the sixth, saw two of it whiffed away in the eighth and then sewed it up in the ninth.

The game was a free hitting affair, the box getting to Wilson for fourteen hits which counted for seventeen bases and the Pioneers nipping Arsenault for twelve hits which were good for sixteen bases. Arsenault struck out seven to Wilson's five, but gave up one base on balls and hit one batsman.

The Sox infield which has been wobbling for the last three games was unsteady again last night and accounted for six damaging errors which gave the Pioneers four unearned runs. The Pioneer infield on the other hand has been steadily improving and last night turned in a nice performance making only three errors. Dave Larkin's triple with two on and two out in the fifth brought in the two tying runs and his score a moment later gave the Pioneers a lead they never lost. Hunter's double in the ninth accounted for most of the other damage. Henry Landry pulled off a nice catch back of third for another highlight of the game.

The next game will be Monday between the Pioneers and Kensington in Kensington.
