Trois-Rivieres Bridge Site Is Selected

QUEBEC (CP)—Roads Minister Bernard Pinard has announced a site has been chosen for a bridge across the St. Lawrence River at Trois-Rivieres, Que., and construction is expected to start this fall or early 1964. It is hoped the bridge, to be the only one across the St. Lawrence between Montreal and Quebec City, will be completed before World's Fair in Montreal. Cost of the structure, to be 150 feet over the ship channel, is estimated at \$30,000,000. The bridge will be some 9,000 feet long. Mr. Pinard told a press conference he will be located in the upstream outskirts of Trois-Rivieres and will run across the river to St. George's-le-Grand.

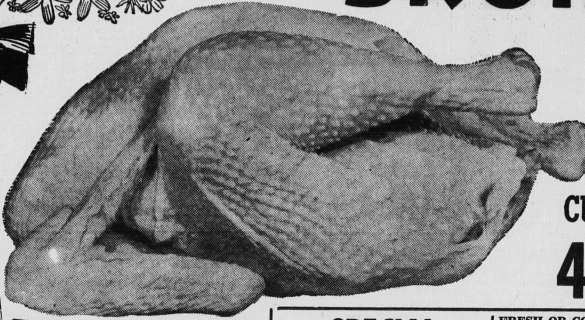
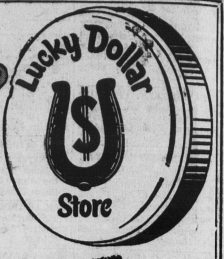
Federal Agency On Feed Grain Recommended

OTTAWA (CP)—A federal agency serving feed-grain consumers was recommended Wednesday by the Canadian Federation of Agriculture in its first appearance before the new Liberal government. The federation's executive met Agriculture Minister Harry Hays and Rene Tremblay, minister without portfolio who is to become a second agriculture minister specifically in charge of eastern Canadian farm affairs. The feed-grain Crown agency was the only new item in the list of proposals discussed in a general way. They included an early start on a national school milk program and establishment of a Canadian dairy advisory council—the latter already begun under the former Conservative government.

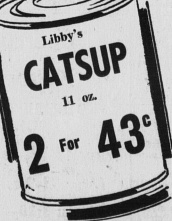
