GERMANY AND UNITED STATES.

Friendly Speeches Made in the Reichstag.

GERMAN POLITICIANS SURPRISED AT FLATTERING WORDS.

Re-entrance of Prince Herbert Bismark in Politics.

[SPECIAL TO THE EXAMINER.]

BERLIN, Feb. 13.—In the Reichstag, on Saturday, Baron Von Bulow, Minister of Foreign Affairs, made a powerful speech which was generously applauded, in which he expressed the utmost cordiality towards the United States.

Prince Herbert Bismark also spoke on practically the same lines.

Political circles are greatly astonished at this pronounced support of Von Bulow and it is believed that this appearance of the Prince in the Reichstag foreshadows his re-entrance into the field of diplomacy. Some express the opinion that he will be sent to Washington as he spoke in such flattering terms of the Americans.

FATAL FIRE IN MONTREAL

One Fireman Killed, One Fatally Injured.

A WALL FELL IN ON A FIRE-MAN'S LADDER

Big Business Block Burned Loss Estimated at \$10,000.

MONTREAL, Feb. 13.—One fireman lost his life and another was probably fatally injured by a fire yesterday. The block burned contained Hirsch's grocery store, a branch of the Banque Ville Niane, and a couple of boarding houses.

During the progress of the fire a wall toppled over onto a ladder on which were firemen E. J. Smith and Jos Mooney.

Smith was instantly killed, and Mooney, who was a well known professional runner, is probably fatally injured. The property loss is estimated at ten thousand dollars.

BUILDING A BRIDGE BY MINUTE OF COUNCIL.
