

## Tighter Program Is Planned To End U.S. Dollar Drain

 WASHINGTON (CP)—A tighter, but still voluntary, program for ending the United States dollar drain is planned for 1966.

American business will be asked to cut back farther on direct investment abroad and more pressure may be applied to encourage American tourists to stay home. Treasury Secretary Henry Fowler and Commerce Secretary John Connor held a press conference here.

They announced a balance-of-payments deficit for the third quarter of \$485,000,000 compared with a surplus—the first since 1958—of \$247,000,000 for the previous three months.

"A cause for both satisfaction and concern," said Connor, noting on the credit side that trade exports were up, imports were down and the drain in gold had been sharply reduced to less than \$100,000,000.

The figures for the first nine months of the year worked out to an annual deficit of \$1,250,000,000 compared with the 1964 deficit of \$2,800,000,000 and that of \$2,70,000,000 a year earlier.

**WAR IS EXPENSIVE**

Implicit in Wednesday's message that more progress must be made was the steadily rising bill for the Vietnamese war. Its scale can't be judged, the cabinet secretaries said, but it was suggested it offsets other U.S. foreign military economies.

There was no direct Canadian application to Wednesday's figures except for the likelihood of an intensified campaign—which had little impact this year—to persuade Americans to stay home in 1966 and entice more foreign tourists to the U.S.

Canada is exempt from efforts to prune direct American investment and retains a partial exemption from the tax applied to American purchases of foreign securities.

However, the latest word on the U.S. position will be discussed in Ottawa Friday at the second meeting of a special Canada-U.S. committee formed earlier this year to maintain a close eye on balance-of-payment situations in each country.

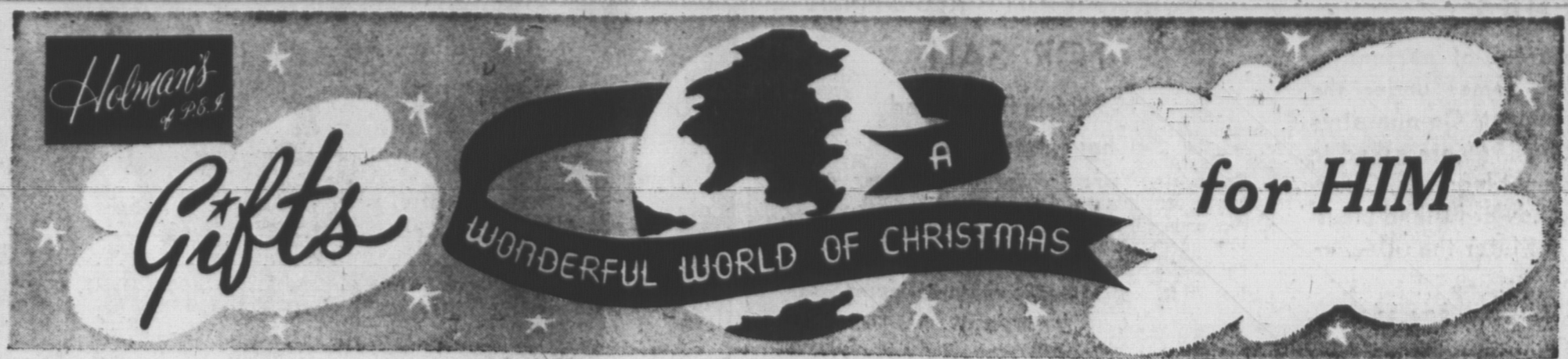

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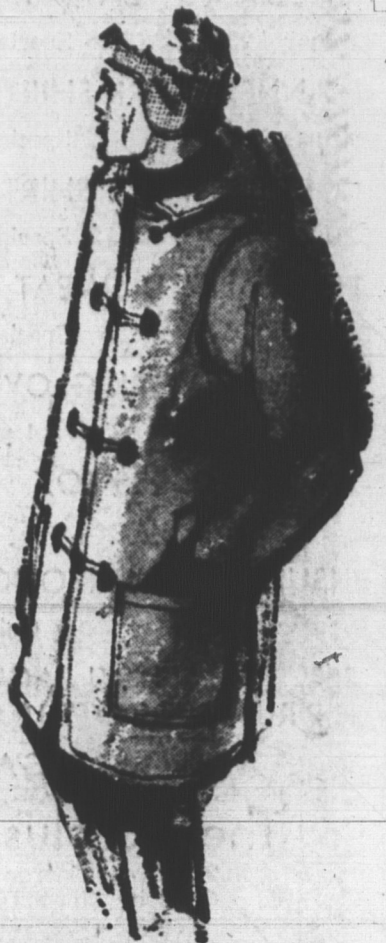
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
