**Logging Research Is Planned**  
OTTAWA (CP) — A \$76,000 research project to improve logging methods on small and medium sized freehold woodlots in New Brunswick was announced here Tuesday.  
The costs will be shared by the New Brunswick and federal governments under the Agricultural and Rural Development Administration. Initial research will be done at University of New Brunswick and the Maritime Forest Rangers School.  
One objective is to develop ways of training and organizing mobile cutting crews for the woodlots, which are among New Brunswick's most productive forest lands.
