Correspondence

To the Editor of L'IMPARTIAL,
 Sir—Thinking that your readers of Tignish and elsewhere might be interested in the Dairy-ing industry, I feel like giving some particulars concerning this industry in this section.

On the 18th January, the annual meeting of the Stock holders of the Alberton Dairying Association was held in the County Court House. There were present quite a representative gathering of stock holders in the association as well as patrons. Mr John T. Weeks, our esteemed president, presided. The secretary Mr. Brennan, read the minutes of our last annual meeting which were unanimously adopted, and then gave a statement of the year's business.

There were manufactured during the year past 62,800 lbs. of cheese from 645,196 lbs. of milk, or a pound of cheese from about 10 1/4 lbs of milk for which was charged 1 1/2 cts per pound of cheese manufactured, being the same as the government always charged us which made a revenue to the stock holders of \$85 together with 6 per cent payable on the paid up stock by patrons amounting to \$86. After paying all expenses of management and manufacturing left a balance in favor of Stock-holders equal to 14 per cent on their paid up capital in the factory. You will clearly see by this that your people need have no hesitation under proper management and fair patronage to invest their money in taking stock in the Tignish cheese factory. Now, with regard to our Patrons, we have paid them up to this date 50 cts. per hundred pounds on their milk and have 214 boxes of cheese in cold storage in Halifax, or about 14,700 lbs. which we expect to get about 9 or 10 cts. per pound for. And we feel safe in saying, if we realize anything like our expectations from this unsold cheese, we may be able to pay our patrons fourteen or twenty cents more for their milk, and I think all will agree that our patrons will be very much better off than if they had made their milk into butter which at the present time, is difficult to sell at any price.

I frequently see people trying to sell butter here about the streets and have to take it home there being no market for it. I hope Tignish will push the industry forward and if good progress is made we may soon be able to establish a central creamery station in the first electoral district of Prince County. Our best patrons here assert there is more money for them at 50 cts. per 100 lbs for milk than to make dairy butter, and we also find those are the men who make the most pork and are in every particular the most progressive farmers. The time for

running out lands to grow oats and potatoes to truck to market is past and the sooner our farmers realize this the better for themselves in particular and for the merchants in general.

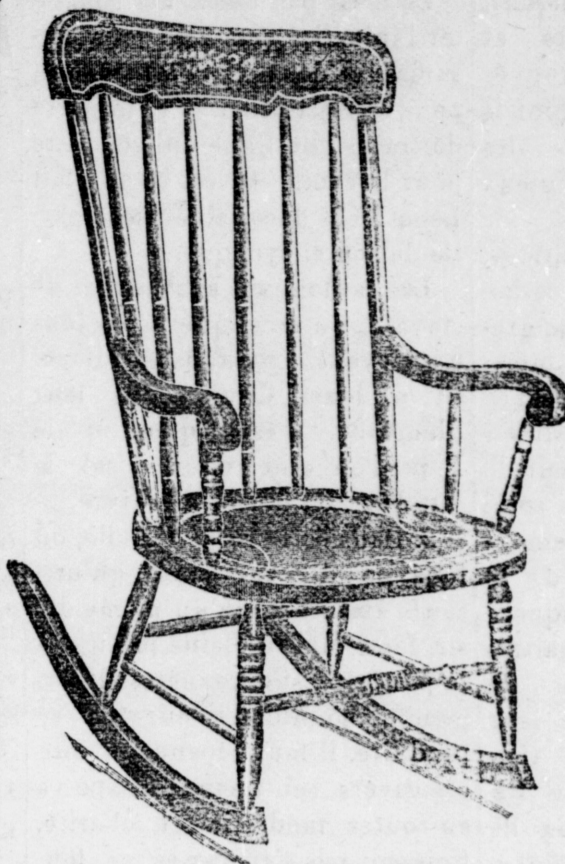

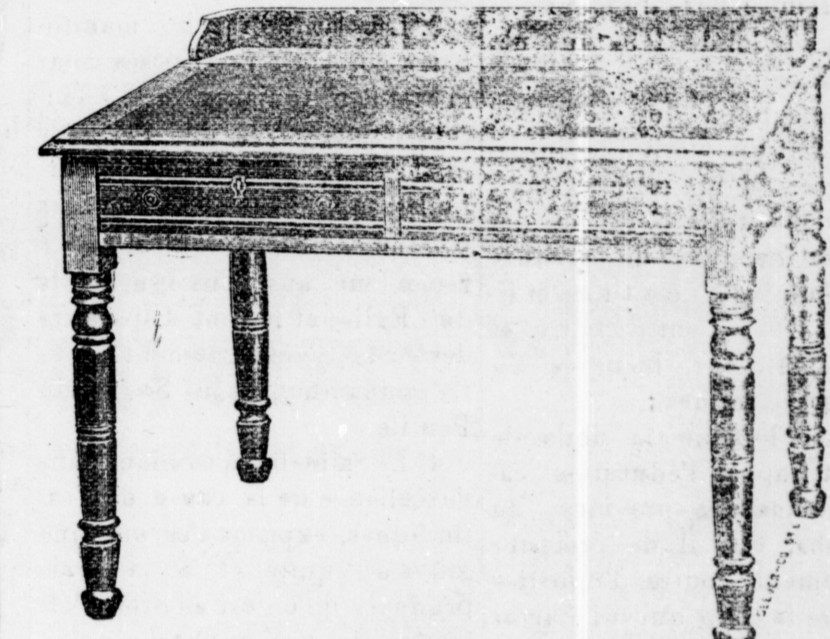
