It is the closest thing to home. My father is in the services and so I can get first year partly paid.



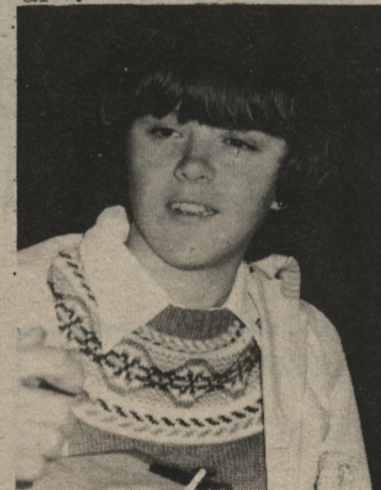
Steven MacLean Charlottetown

I want to take engineering and all the other engineering programs in the Atlantic provinces have the same program as here, so I thought I'd stay on P.E.I. where my friends are.



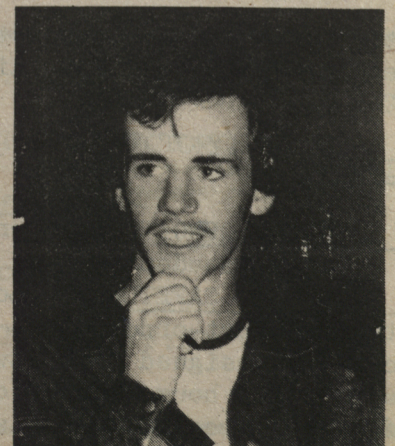
Wendy Jessome Cape Breton
