Such an appointment coming after the great service he has rendered to Greater Britain, and the establishment of the new dominion, would be most popular; but it is doubtful if the old warrior would accept such an arduous post.

The Empire, of London, says that when Canadians so generously and spontaneously came to the aid of the Mother Country they did it from no sordid or calculating motives. Their action was the outcome of the purest Imperial patriotism. But the results are as likely to be just as gratifying to them from a maternal standpoint as to the Mother Country from the moral standpoint. British people have displayed increased interest in the country which owned such fighters. They have discovered that British Columbia has wonderful mining resources, and that some few British companies are reaping a big harvest from their investments. When the war is over, British capital will flow there in larger quantities than ever before, seeking investments in mines. Then will come the long-expected boom. Thus the Canadian contingent has not only covered its native land with the glory of its splendid deeds, but also attracted to Canada immense material advantage.

Ever since the famous Raid Dr. Jameson has elected to live in complete obscurity. Patiently and silently he has taken the "gruel" administered to him by the world after his failure. It is perhaps considered that the time has come for him to re-assume the prominent position he formerly occupied in South Africa. He had just been appointed a director of De Beers, and selected as a candidate for the Cape Parliament. Certainly all Jameson's friends will welcome his return to active public life.

Lord Salisbury is quite happy when he is alone in his chemical laboratory trying experiments. "I literally blow to atoms my £5,000 every year," he once said to his old friend the Lord Chancellor, Lord Halsbury. "Two of the greatest delights in life to me," continued the Marquis, "are trying chemical experiments and listening to the abuse of my enemies!"

### GEN. FRENCH.

One of our American exchanges writes most appreciatively of General French. I says this famous cavalry officer under Lord Roberts, got the most practical part of his training in the Canadian northwest, where he organized the well-known regiment of rough riders known as the Canadian Northwest Mounted Police. He could hardly have had a more suitable training for his work under Roberts, and his success is doubtless in part explained by it. He learned Indian tricks and tactics not only on the Prairies, but among the passes of the Rocky mountains, and became one of the most expert of scouts. A similar experience could not have been had in any European army, except, perhaps, among the Czar's Cossacks. "It is suggestive," continues our exchange, "that the necessity of organizing cavalry, or mounted infantry, with special reference to Indian warfare on this continent should have been the cause of an important modification in that arm of the service in several armies. Heavy cavalry has been made obsolete by it. Gen. French is nothing more than an Indian fighter putting his experience to good use on the South African veldt, having been trained to meet horsemen who were far more expert masters in riding than the Boers, though not such excellent marksmen. This seems to be a cavalry officers' war, and the mobility which has flanked and routed the Boers so often was not learned in England."
