PRINCE EDWARD ISLAND.

No. 31. DOWNING STREET, 2d Dec., 1867.

I have the honor to inform you that Her Majesty will not be advised to exercise her power of disallowance in respect of the following Acts of the Legislature of Prince Edward Island which accompanied your Despatch of the 22d ultimo, viz:—

Cap. 4, 17 May, 1867.—An Act authorising the establishment of additional Small Debt Courts at Somerset and Montague Bridge, and for other purposes.

Cap. 5, 17th May, 1867.—An Act to continue certain Acts therein mentioned.

Cap. 7, 17th May, 1867.—An Act for appropriating certain moneys therein mentioned for the service of the year 1867.

Cap. 8, 17th May, 1867.—An Act to continue and amend certain Acts therein mentioned relating to Education.

Cap. 9, 17th May, 1867.—An Act for the Incorporation of a Flax Company in Prince Edward Island.

Cap. 10, 17th May, 1867.—An Act to Incorporate an Hotel Company in Charlottetown.

Cap. 11, 17th May, 1867.—An Act to amend the Act relating to Land Assessment.

Cap. 12, 17th May, 1867.—An Act to add to the Act exempting property belonging to Her Majesty and the Government from duties or assessment.

Cap. 14, 17th May, 1867.—An Act to remove, continue and amend the Act relating to the limits and rules of Gaols in this Island.

Cap. 15, 17th May, 1867.—An Act in addition to and to amend the Act for establishing the Prince of Wales College.

Cap. 16, 17th May, 1867.—An Act to diminish the delay and expense of proceedings in the Court of Chancery in this Island.

Cap. 17, 17th May, 1867.—An Act to amend the Act of the 29th Victoria, Chapter the 29th, relating to Trustees, and the Act relating to Judgments in the Supreme Court binding Leaseholds.

Cap. 18, 17th May, 1867.—An Act relating to practice and pleading in the Supreme Court.

Cap. 19, 17th May, 1867.—An Act to incorporate the Alberton Masonic Hall Company.

Cap. 20.—An Act to enable George C. Stiles to obtain Letters Patent for the invention of a new and useful improvement in the construction of Spinning Wheels.
