Proposes Hookup Between Quebec, American Leagues

MONTREAL (CP)—An interlocking schedule between the Quebec Hockey League and the American Hockey League is proposed by George (Punch) Imlach as a means of putting his Quebec Aces back in the black. Last season the Aces showed a deficit of \$30,000 dollars. Imlach's plan will be presented when the QHL convenes here June 9 for its annual general meeting. The proposal tentatively calls for each of the six American teams to run through the QHL circuit playing five games in a stretch in Chicoutimi, Quebec, Trois Rivières, Shawinigan and Montreal. The five-team Canadian loop would reciprocate by playing in the American cities. All QHL teams are expected to operate again next year, with the Valleyfield Braves as a possible sixth entry.

'Copters For Geological Survey Parties This Year

OTTAWA (CP)—A federal geological survey party will use helicopters for the first time this year in large scale mapping of mountainous country. Mines Minister Prudham said Wednesday in a statement that two helicopters will be used by a 35-man party which will map a 25,000 square mile area of the Caspian mountains and Stikine plateau in northern British Columbia. The party will be one of 73 which will be engaged this summer and fall in mapping projects in all provinces, the Yukon, the Northwest Territories and Labrador. The project will be Operation Stikine, directed by the geological survey of Canada, a branch of the mines department.

DOGS AND CANOES In sharp contrast to Operation Stikine two other parties will use dog teams and canoes to conduct a coastal reconnaissance in the remote areas of Ellesmere and northwest Baffin island in the Arctic archipelago.

There will be a substantial increase in the number of mapping parties operating in the Maritimes. Five parties will work in the orchard hinterland of central Nova Scotia three parties will conduct a large-scale geochemical exploration program, supplemented by

aeromagnetic surveys in the same area. Other parties will study mineral areas in the Yukon, B.C., Saskatchewan, Quebec, Labrador, New Brunswick and Newfoundland.

Report Marked Progress With Doukhobor Children

VANCOUVER (CP)—Doukhobor children whose parents oppose their enforced attendance at school are taking to education like ducks to water, reports Jean Howarth, Daily Province columnist.

After visiting the New Denver school, 40 miles north of Nedsion, Miss Howarth wrote, in part, as follows:

"The Doukhobor children are held at the New Denver school dormitory because their parents refuse to send them to school; but they take to schooling like ducks to water."

Raft Close To Sable Island

HALIFAX (CP)—The raft L'E-gare was only 20 miles southwest of Sable Island late Wednesday and its four occupants, trying to drift to Europe, hoped for a change of course so they would miss the sandy dot of land. Sunday night the raft was 90 miles south of the island and since then it has gradually moved closer.

The four French-born adventurers didn't say what direction they were following Wednesday. A message to the Maritime ham radio network gave the raft's position and said they were all well. They described the weather as cold, and so far only one fish has been caught for their two cats.
