Arnold Palmer Is Stricken With Attack Of Bursitis

AKRON, Ohio (AP)—Arnold Palmer, golf's No. 1 money-winner, was stricken with a painful case of bursitis in his right shoulder Thursday, 10 hours before he was to tee off against Jack Nicklaus, Julius Boro and Bob Charles in the \$75,000 World Series of Golf.

"It hurts every time I hit the ball," Palmer said as he struggled through a practice round with the other three series competitors, but right now it hurts more than it did earlier in the day. But it isn't the pain that bothers me. I can't hit the ball right, especially on my drive.

"I've had it x-rayed and there is apparently nothing wrong of a serious nature," Palmer said. "I'm taking some pills the doctor prescribed, but right now it hurts more than it did earlier in the day. But it isn't the pain that bothers me. I can't hit the ball right, especially on my drive."

"Something gets right under my shoulder when I start my swing. It feels like I'm getting into the ball properly and everything I hit goes off my drive."

Palmer, with official PGA earnings of \$101,585, the first professional to top the \$100,000 mark in a single year, said the right shoulder has been bothering him while he was in California last week.
