Debate on the Budget.

We publish to-day the concluding portion of the speech delivered by Hon. Mr. Sullivan, on moving the House of Assembly into Committee on Supply.

The exhibit of the past year is, perhaps, the most satisfactory that has been made since we entered the Confederation.

The reply of the Leader of the Opposition was short; but Mr. Yeo did not fail to score all the points which could fairly be scored against the financial position of the Government.

The Hon. Mr. Ferguson's speech was one of his ablest efforts. It was, indeed, an exhaustive review of the financial history of the Province in recent years.

Hon. Mr. Campbell made an able defence of the Public Works Department, showing that he had received freely from the Government all the money he required for the maintenance of roads, bridges and wharves.

In a short business speech Mr. Bentley dealt effectually with the finances of the Province; and Mr. McKay and others spoke forcibly and well.
