A LESSON may be taken from the system of sewerage in Pullman, Ill. The town lies on a fat prairie. Sewers are built to empty into a sunken tank, from which the sewage is pumped through a twenty-inch main to a farm three miles away. The system cost \$80,000; and yields a profit of \$8,500 a year.

The London Society for Promoting State Aided Emigration will send a mission to the east end of London to enquire into the condition of the working classes there, with the view of ascertaining how many persons among them may feel inclined to emigrate to north-western Canada. The results of the inquiry will be furnished the Government.

At a meeting of the Commissioners of the Dominion and Centennial Exhibition, held in St. John last Friday morning, it was unanimously resolved to present to the widow of the late Dr. Elder the life-size crayon sketch of the deceased gentleman, which was exhibited at the recent Exhibition by Mr. Geo. W. Schleyer, of Fredericton. The commission took this means of showing their appreciation of Dr. Elder's labors in connection with the Centennial Exhibition, the success of which was one of the thoughts nearest his heart when death called him away. -Globe.

A SPECIAL cablegram received at Ottawa on the 18th, states that by the official list of awards at the fisheries exhibition, Canada obtains gold medals for the best collection of cured tinned fish, shipped fish, salmon nets, deep sea fishing gear, fishing boats, whale oil, signalling telegraph system, most complete breeding establishment, and steam fishing tug. The Dominion exhibit was also awarded five medals for distinct varieties of fish of commercial value and also fifteen silver medals six bronze medals, and four diplomas. Special mention was also made in the award list about twelve other awards in reference to which decision has not yet been reached. Newfoundland obtained ten gold medals, eight silver medals, five bronze medals and three diplomas.

WITH reference to the prize "Barrister" coat, sold by the Hon. Lauchlin McMillan, of Covehead, to Mr. David J. Murray, of Truro, N. S., the Halifax Herald says: "Mr. David J. Murray, owner of the 'Frank Allison' stalin 'Messenger Clay,' has recently purchased and brought to Truro a very fine Clydesdale entire colt, one year old, which he intends using for stock purposes in the Province. The colt is a beautiful bay, with black points. His weight is 1000 pounds. He is named 'Young Barrister.' His sire 'Barrister' (imported by 'Emperor' is a splendid animal, who was brought some years ago to P. E. Island, His dam, 'Kate,' by imported 'Stockman,' was until recently also owned in P. E. Island, and is considered one of the best brood mares in the country. 'Young Barrister' was purchased by Mr. Murray from the Hon. Lauchlin McMillan, of Woburn Cottage Farm, Covehead, P. E. Island. The dam and a suckling colt were recently sold by Mr. McMillan, for a large amount in New Brunswick. Experienced horsemen are unanimous in their admiration of 'Young Barrister,' and his introduction will, no doubt, be a great benefit to the future breeding of horses for draft and agricultural purposes."

THE North Sydney Herald says: "Michael McDonald, of Cherry Valley, a small produce shipping place about ten miles from Charlottetown, P. E. Island, has grown on his farm this summer grafted potatoes. Mr. McDonald, who has just arrived at that port from Newfoundland, where he has disposed of a cargo of potatoes, informs us that he had about three hundred bushels of the grafted potatoes mixed through the cargo, and had he kept the grafted separate, he could have named his own figure for them. One old man came in from ten miles outside of St. John's to learn the art of grafting. He said he 'wondered how they could graft on the potato stock.' The grafting is done in the following manner: for instance, we will take a 'blue' and an 'early rose.' Supposing we want a potato from the two, we cut up each out of the 'blue,' then we cut an eye out of the 'early rose' and insert it in one of the eye holes of the 'blue.' We then go over with the grafting wax, (same as in tree grafting) when the 'blue' is planted whole, and as above described, the potatoes produced from it will be half 'blue' and half 'early rose.' The grafted potato, when planted, of course reproduces itself."

TELEGRAPHIC NEWS.

[SPECIAL DESPATCHES TO THE EXAMINER.] Gone to Meet the Marquis of Lansdowne. OTTAWA, Oct. 22. All the Ministers and Judges of the Supreme Court have gone to Quebec to meet the Marquis of Lansdowne.

Disappeared. OTTAWA, Oct. 22. It is feared that Albert Hill, the missing Prescott Station Master, has been drugged and robbed in Montreal, as he had a large amount of money on his person and was under the influence of liquor at the time of his disappearance.

Militia Supplies. OTTAWA, Oct. 22. The militia department advertises for 1,500 tunics of blue cloth, 500 jackets of blue serge, 2,400 pairs blue serge trousers, 1,000 caps, 2,000 great coats (blue cloth) for artillery; and for infantry 4,000 pairs of trousers (blue serge), 200 caps, 300 pairs of breeches for rifles. The department also advertises for 2,000 tunics of rifle green cloth, and 2,400 pairs of trousers of rifle green serge.

Lord Coleridge. WASHINGTON, Oct. 22. Lord Coleridge visited Mount Vernon on Saturday. In the evening he attended a dinner in his honor given by Justice Grey of the Supreme Court. Among those present were President Arthur and Cabinet, Justices of the Supreme Court, Generals and distinguished citizens.

Trichonosis in Germany. BERLIN, Oct. 22. There were 266 persons suffering from trichonosis at Ernsteben to-day, only fifty of 134 houses are free from the disease. Up to yesterday morning twenty-two persons had died. There has also been several fatal cases of the disease at Aken.

Another Assignment. OTTAWA, Oct. 22. A. J. Nordhansten & Co., butter manufacturers in Montreal have assigned with liabilities of \$11,900.

Yellow Fever. BREWTON, Oct. 22. To date there have been 34 cases of yellow fever and 18 deaths.

Yellow Fever. HAVANA, Oct. 22. Eighteen deaths from yellow fever occurred here last night.

Telegraph Notes. According to official reports the plague at Breslau is not likely to spread beyond the present limits.

An explosion recently occurred in Warncliffe, Carlton Colliery, near Barnsley, Yorkshire; twenty-three men were in the pit at the time, and it is believed they all perished.

When the tunnel under the river Severn flooded on the 19th inst., there were one hundred men inside. They barely escaped being drowned. Two fell from a ladder on which they were endeavoring to reach the surface and were killed.

Henry W. Gwinner, president of the Hoole Manufacturing Company and National Railroad publication Company, committed suicide Friday Evening last in New York, by shooting himself in the head. His salary from the two companies was \$10,000 a year. He also had an income from other sources. No cause is assigned.
