The death occurred at the Prince Edward Island Hospital on Monday, June 27, 1966 of William H. Ward in his sixty-first year. He had been in ill health for nearly a year and was in the hospital since March.

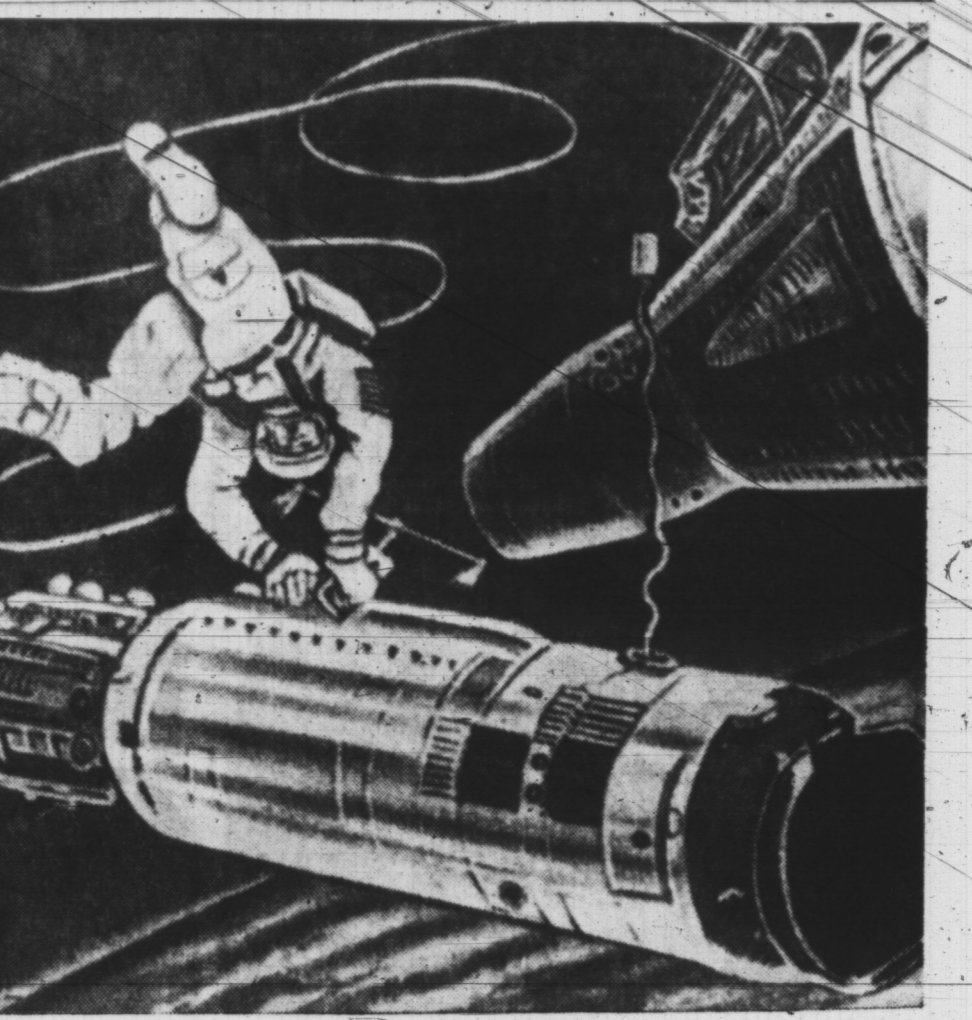

The first girls to die when an intruder methodically marched him who I was and asked him if he wanted me to represent him.

"He said he did. I informed him his brother and his brother-in-law were outside and asked him if he wanted to see them. He said he did not."

PHYSICIAN STOOD BY
During his visit with the defendant, Getty was accompanied by the city jail physician. Norcross said in court there is a "substantial possibility" that Speck suffered a mild coronary thrombosis (heart attack) Tuesday.

The defendant complained of chest pains shortly after he was confronted in his hospital room by Miss Amuro, 23, a Filipino exchange nurse who escaped being the ninth victim by hiding under a bed.

Getty said outside the courtroom that although the defence has not decided on a course of action, there will be sanity hearing for Speck.
