Cancer Campaign Here Underway 1st Of April

April is Cancer Crusade Month in Canada, and it was learned last evening from Frank J. MacDonald, president of the local division of the Canadian Cancer Society, that the island annual cancer campaign will get underway the first week in April, with the campaign running throughout the month.

James Allen of Charlottetown, who has been named provincial campaign chairman, has announced a provincial objective of \$10,000, and officials are hopeful that with the continued support and co-operation shown by the people of the province in the past, this objective may be realized.

Mr. Allen likens the cancer problem to a giant jigsaw in which thousands of separate pieces of knowledge are being fitted together to create the final picture — the knowledge of the cause and cure for this nation's number two killer. "The key to this puzzle," he says, "is research, and today, there are more than 200 Canadian scientists and technicians in a score of laboratories across the land, working on 117 different projects — all pieces of that giant puzzle."

Mr. Allen reminded citizens that while not all can be part of these vital teams, there is one way in which all can help, and that is by contributing at campaign time, so that these research scientists can continue "on their jobs" to find new clues to fathom the mysteries of a disease which takes the lives of 1,000 Canadians a year.

WINCHESTER, Mass. — Leigh Stanley Roberts of 169 Cambridge Road, Woburn, a former resident of Winchester, passed away Monday, March 1, at the Grover Manor Hospital. Mr. Roberts was 82 years of age.

Born in Winsloe, Prince Edward Island, Mr. Roberts was the son of the late John L. Roberts and Elizabeth Shaw Roberts.

He came to Winchester when he was eight years of age, and resided there for 70 years. He was employed on the highway department of the town and served as a call fireman on the Winchester Fire Department for over 40 years.

Mr. Roberts was a member of the Crawford Memorial Methodist Church, and had been a resident of Woburn for the past five years.

Surviving are his wife, Jennie A. (Cudmore) Roberts, two sons, L. Stanley Jr. and Donald C. both of Winchester, a daughter, Mrs. Russell B. (Elizabeth) Totman of Woburn; seven grandchildren and one sister, Mrs. Helen Dewar of Winchester.
