Returning Officers Appointed

OTTAWA (CP)—The cabinet has appointed 103 returning officers for the next federal election and many more will be named shortly, it was learned.

The appointees of the Liberal government comprise 72 newcomers and 31 persons who had experience in supervising previous elections. Most of the 263 present returning officers were appointed in 1960 by the Diefenbaker government.

Under the massive redistribution of seats that became law in July, 264 federal ridings were established and the posts of returning officer became vacant. The cabinet has been making new appointments almost every week since then.

Chief Electoral Officer Jean-Marc Hamel said in an interview Friday that the new officials are being brought in groups of five to 15 for crash courses in election regulations and procedures.

Before the next general election can be held, the returning officers will have to wade through the 1965 voters' lists, update them and relocate polling divisions in line with new constituency boundaries and population shifts.

KEEP CHANGING OF GUARD
