

Older Boys "Parliament" To Meet Next Week

An older boys model parliament of Prince Edward Island will convene in the Legislative Assembly Room of the Provincial Building on Friday, April 15 at 7 p.m. Hon. A. W. Matheson, after a meeting of the Government announced that the room would be available for the model parliament.

Legislation to be debated by the members will include moral problems, the Christian faith, and the Lord's Day Act, temperance and sports.

Various churches of the City were represented on a planning committee under the chairmanship of Rev. G. Howard Christie of Trinity Church. Mr. R. J. Rupert is acting as registrar and about forty to fifty boys between sixteen and twenty-one are expected to attend.

Mr. David MacDonald, Fitzroy Street, will act as premier. Malcolm MacRae of Cherry Valley as deputy premier and Dave Stewart as Speaker of the house. The cabinet will include Gordon MacBeth, minister of devotional affairs and Niels Hansen, minister of physical affairs. A minister of social affairs and of temperance will also be appointed.

Registration will be on Friday afternoon in Zion Church Hall and the opening of the parliament in the Provincial Building will be in the evening with the reading of the Speech from the Throne, the oath of allegiance and appointment of committees.

Sessions will be held Saturday afternoon and evening and Sunday afternoon. The closing proposition ceremony is scheduled for 4 p.m. Sunday. Various homes in the city will be entertaining out of town delegates.
