### Arson Charge Faces Souris Man

GEORGETOWN — Lawrence Edward Burke, Cardigan North, appeared before Magistrate Charles R. MacQuaid at Georgetown yesterday, charged with attempted arson.

Burke, who is represented by Vernon J. Fraser, Souris, electrician, pleaded not guilty. The case was adjourned to May 20 for hearing at Georgetown. Bail was set at \$1,000, a recognizance of \$1,000 with one surety, Raymond Fletcher MacMaster, Dundas, was further remanded in custody to May 20 on a charge of obtaining goods from Clem Campbell, and Dundas, of the value of \$50 by false pretences and with intent to defraud. He is represented by Vernon Fraser.

Wilfred Edward McQuillan, Georgetown and Harry Grey Myers, Montague, each had their cases of separate charges of selling liquor, not being a vendor, adjourned to May 20 for hearing.

Three persons were each fined \$20 and costs for having possession of liquor in a place other than a residence.

## Dragger Construction Is Possibly Delayed

Seven steel draggers may not be built as planned because of a housing shortage. Odd though that may seem, it is true. Baburist Macrae Ltd., who are at present erecting a plant in Georgetown, reported yesterday that company officials are experiencing difficulties in obtaining suitable housing for personnel they plan to bring into Georgetown.

The \$500,000 plant is scheduled for completion by July 1, and it was originally hoped to enter operation almost immediately. It now looks as though work on the draggers will have to wait.

Several weeks now the company has been advertising for suitable housing to accommodate the incoming personnel. A company spokesman said, "At least 16 single houses will be needed for staff who may wish to buy their own homes, and 20 more houses and apartments for other families."

He said that no trouble is anticipated in placing about 20 single men in the town of Georgetown. Again, finding accommodation for 25 to 30 Islanders who have applied for work at the plant may prove extremely difficult. The spokesman said the company is very much interested in taking on these people, mostly in the semi-skilled section, because some of their applications are "very good."

### Fisheries Dept. Prosecutes

Seventeen cases were prosecuted by the department of fisheries at Kings County Court in Souris yesterday, before acting Magistrate Charles R. MacQuaid. Deputy Attorney General J. Arthur MacGilligan, QC, represented the crown in all cases.

John Joseph Perry, Bristol and Melvin MacLaren, Morell, were each fined \$10 and costs or five days when they pleaded guilty to separate charges of setting their lobster gear before the opening of the season.

Alfred MacLaren, Morell, charged with setting out with his gear before the lobster season opened, was fined \$15 and costs or 10 days. Michael Bernard MacGuire, Mt. Stewart, charged with hit and run on May 10, was fined \$30 or 30 days.

Stewart James Coffin, Kingsboro, pleaded not guilty to a charge of impaired driving and was fined \$20 and costs or 10 days. Charged with break and entry of the Morell Regional High School and theft of \$8.40, Gerald Brian MacDonald, Morell, was given a two-year suspended sentence, is to post bond of \$1,000, and is to be in \$10,000 every night when he pleads guilty to separate charges of setting their lobster gear before the opening of the season.
