**Canada's Payments Deficit Is Reported At Near-Record**

OTTAWA (CP)—Canada had a near-record \$396,000,000 deficit in its balance of international payments during January, February and March this year, the Dominion Bureau of Statistics has reported.  
But a new compilation of figures, adjusting receipts and payments for seasonal trends, indicates the deficit was only half that size when special circumstances were taken into account.  
The special circumstances included the Ontario truckers strike, which slowed down Canadian imports while having a lesser effect on export performance, and big export gains in cars, trucks and parts under the U.S.-Canada automotive free trade agreement.  
The bureau's estimates of activity in the first quarter of 1966 gave this picture:  
—Merchandise imports amounted to \$2,215,000,000, leaving a \$2,000,000 trade deficit after merchandise exports amounting to \$2,213,000,000. This compared with a trade surplus of \$16,000,000 in the previous three months, and a \$42,000,000 deficit in the first quarter of 1965.  
—The current account deficit was covered by a net inflow of \$275,000,000 in capital and a running down of \$139,000,000 in Canada's official holdings of gold, foreign exchange, and net balance with the International Monetary Fund.  
The bureau's compilation of exports and imports of goods and services on a seasonally-adjusted basis is new this year. The compilation should be useful in analysing trends, although data on capital movements and

sources of financing are irregular and cannot be put on a seasonally-adjusted basis, DBS said.  
The \$187,000,000 seasonally-adjusted figure for the current account deficit is about half the figure on the same basis for the final quarter of 1965, \$375,000,000, which the bureau said was a record for several years.  
There were several special factors making the merchandise trade balance exceptionally favorable in the latest three-month period, the bureau said.  
**RETARDED IMPORTS**  
A strike in the trucking industry in Ontario retarded the flow of imports from the United States—more than exports.  
Under the stimulus of the automotive free trade agreement, the increase between the first quarters of 1965 and 1966 in exports of cars, trucks and parts to the United States, topped \$140,000,000 and this gain alone is large enough to account for much of the export rise.  
"There also appears to have been a substantial rise in imports of vehicles and parts from the United States, but precise figures are not yet available.  
The eventual seasonal patterns of these new movements in automobiles and parts are not yet known.

**Pathologists Are Accused Of Monopoly**

CHICAGO (AP) — The U.S. Justice department has accused the College of American Pathologists of conspiring to fix prices and monopolize the medical laboratory field.  
A civil suit filed in U.S. district court by the department's anti-trust division said the laboratories are mostly owned by members of the college and take in \$3,000,000,000 a year.  
The suit claims that starting in 1947 the college, engaged in an unlawful conspiracy to restrain and monopolize the laboratory field strictly for the profit of pathologists.  
It said that in doing so, persons requiring the services of medical laboratories have had to pay "excessively high prices."  
**IMPOSE BOYCOTT**  
The suit says commercial laboratories not owned by pathologists have been subject to boycotts by pathologists and doctors, and have been prevented from developing new markets "free of unreasonable restraint on competition."  
Hospitals, clinics and sanatoriums also have been subjected to boycotts, the suit charges, unless the entire profit from the operation of the medical laboratory in the institution goes solely to the pathologists.  
The suit claims virtually all the commercial medical laboratories in the United States, including those in hospitals, are owned by members of the college.  
Because of the alleged conspiracy, the suit charges, chemists, biologists, and other persons who are not pathologists are being forced out of business regardless of the quality of the services they perform.  
Officials of the college did not comment immediately.

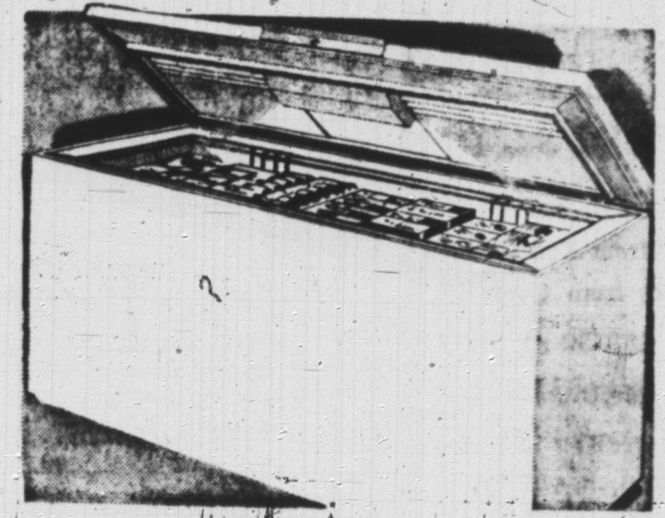
