

BRENTON V. MacLEAN OPENS NEW SHOWROOM AND GARAGE

Ford-Monarch Dealer At Summerside Has Modern New Premises

The building erected on Water Street East by Mr. Brenton V. MacLean has headquarters for his Ford-Monarch dealership and with garage and service station facilities is one of the finest of its kind in the Maritimes.

Built of brick and tile it is 80 feet in length and the front part has a width of 45 feet while the garage at the rear is 50 feet wide. In front there are large plate glass windows set in on a slant which gives an attractive appearance from the street and bring plenty of natural light into the showroom and offices within.

The interior is finished in fir plywood and on the right on entering is the parts department which will be equipped to give the best possible service to customers. Immediately adjacent to the parts department and directly ahead from the entrance is the general office where accounts can be settled and other business transacted. The counter of the general office is a continuation of the counter of the parts department. At the rear of the general office and opening off it is a private office. There is also an entrance to the private office from a hallway that runs from the showroom back to the garage.

The one car showroom is in the front of the building to the left on entering and opposite it will be a salesmen's office. There are also men's and women's lavatories provided. The latest type of fluorescent fixtures are used for lighting. The garage at the rear is 50 by 39 feet and contains several new features. There is an under-floor escape system for exhaust so that the motors of cars being repaired can be run with the garage doors closed with no danger to the people inside. This saves time for the mechanics and preserves the heat of the building.

The radiant heating system, which was installed by R. T. Morrison and Co. is something new here and is possibly the first in the Province in this type of building. The heating pipes are enclosed in the cement floor. This means that the floor is always warm and as warm air rises with the heat coming from the floor the whole building is at an even temperature. It should be, particularly in a garage where men have to work lying on the floor. There is a "hot spot" in the floor which

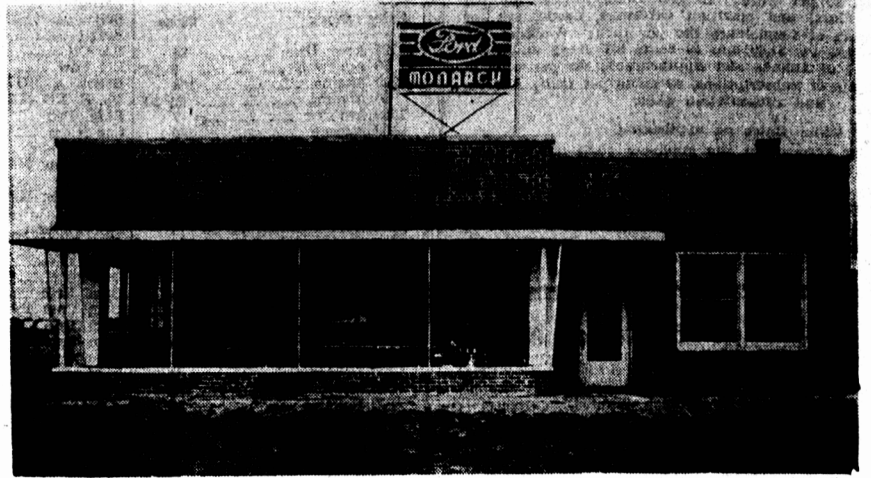
