

Mackenzie Scores Win In P.E.I. District Tourney

Straight shooting Art Mackenzie fired twin rounds of 77 to easily walk home with a victory in the Prince Edward Island district golf tournament Sunday at the Belvedere Club.

Mackenzie's rounds gave him 213 for the 72-hole tournament and six strokes up on runner-up Jack Beaton who carded a 77 and 80 Sunday.

Rounding out the top five were Don MacDonald 323, Wendall Gilles, 327 and Bob Dowling, 333.

These five golfers won the right to compete against four other districts at Edmundston, N.B., July 5 for spots on the Willingdon Cup team.

25 GOLFERS

Twenty-five golfers will be entering this tourney at which the top two will play for the Willingdon Cup. The other two team members will be named at the N.B. - P.E.I. Tournament later in July.

However, the fifth member of the P.E.I. delegation will be Art Mackenzie's younger brother Merlin as Gilles will be unable to

make the trip because of business reasons. Merlin MacKenzie ended the four rounds with a 335 to place

sixth. The caliber of play Sunday was much improved over that at Cavendish last weekend when the golfers had to fight high winds and occasional downpours of rain while travelling the tough par 72-course.

Both Dowling and Merlin MacKenzie slid into the 90s at Cavendish but both showed much better firm in the final 36 holes. Dowling's 73 was the best round of the tournament.

In fact every player who finished the 72 holes showed considerable improvement. Art MacKenzie was five strokes better, Beaton eight, MacDonald five, Gilles 11 and Dowling reduced his score by 19 strokes.

Doug Ford Captures Open; 3-Way Deadlock For 2nd

ISLESMEERE GOLF COURSE, Montreal (CP) — Doug Ford of Paradise, Fla., Sunday won the Canadian Open golf championship with a 72-hole score of 276.

The veteran, who has had a good money year on the pro tour this season although no previous wins, found a two-under-par 70 on the final round was good enough. For the 72-hole distance Ford was 18 under.

FAILS IN CLUTCH

Art Wall, Jr., of Pocono Manor, Pa., with a chance to catch up with Ford, who had finished in the threesome ahead, failed on the last two holes. He needed a birdie and a par to tie.

There was a three-way tie for

second place, two strokes behind Ford.

At 278 were Wall, Bo Winger of Odessa, Texas, and Dow Finsterwald of Tequesta, Fla., who lost his chance early in his round with an awesome eight at the par-five second hole.

Another two strokes away at 290 were Bob Rosburg of Palo Alto, Calif., Don Fairfield of Casey, Ill., and Bruce Crampton of Sydney, Australia.

Crampton and Finsterwald were co-leaders at 295 starting Sunday's final round. Crampton blew to a 75, Finsterwald, ruined by his fat eight at the second, finished with 73. Rosburg, who was suffering from a stomach flu, played his final round in par 72.

Ford collects \$3,500 for his win and also gains possession of the Seagram Gold Cup.

With Sunday's win, Ford has won slightly over \$21,000 this year, Wall is still the top money man with around \$36,000.

The new Canadian Open champion, 36-year-old native of New Haven, Conn., had been out of the money only twice in 102 tournaments.

Stan Leonard of Vancouver was low Canadian for the eighth time. Leonard shot a 71 Sunday to finish with 282, six under par for the 72 holes.

For his four rounds Ford sat 68-69-69-70.

Winger, Finsterwald and Wall collect \$1,866 each for their second-place tie. Fairfield, Rosburg and Crampton collect \$1,200 each.

TIED AT 281

Finishing with 281 were Paul Harney of Worcester, Mass., Billy Maxwell of Odessa, Texas, and Jay Hebert of Sanford, Fla., each wins \$950. Leonard, tied with Ken Venturi of Daly City, Calif., and Tommy Bolt of Crystal River, Fla., at 282 win \$800 plus \$300 as top Canadian.

Ford started Sunday's final round with 206 for 54 holes, tied with Wall one stroke behind Finsterwald and Crampton.

The 23-year-old Australian had been the surprise of the tournament for three rounds with his consistently fine sub-par golf. He started to blow Sunday well down the front nine and never recovered, but the \$1,200 he collects is the biggest pay day he has ever had in his Far East play

Champ Patterson Is Rated Top Choice Over Johansson

NEW YORK (AP) — Speedy Floyd Patterson is a heavy 3½ to 1 favorite to whip Sweden's Ingemar Johansson Thursday night at Yankee Stadium in his fifth defence of the world heavyweight boxing title.

With no free home television and the New York area blacked out on closed-circuit theatre TV, promoter Bill Rosenzohn, hopefully talks about a crowd of 45,000 and a gate of \$700,000 with a \$100 top.

Some think he is about \$200,000 too optimistic. There will be a radio broadcast (ABC) of the 15-round match, scheduled for 10:30 p. m. EDT (8:30 p. m. MDT). The show has run into many difficulties. The promoter and the champion's manager, Gus D'Amato, had an argument that almost led to the bout's removal
