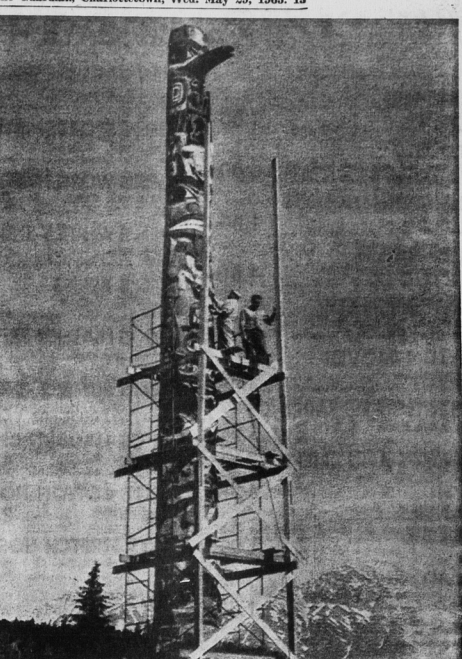

Nuclear Power Plants Said Competitive Now

MONTREAL (CP) - Canadian industry now accepts what the Crown-owned Atomic Energy of Canada has been saying for many years - that Canadian-designed nuclear power plants are capable of producing low-cost electricity.

N. L. Williams, engineering supervisor for the Canadian General Electric Company Limited, told the annual meeting of the Canadian Nuclear Society Tuesday that the technical and economic feasibility of Canadian nuclear plants has been established.

He suggested nuclear power would be cheaper than coal-fired thermal power plants.

Mr. Williams said that for many years Atomic Energy of Canada had predicted low-cost power from nuclear power plants using natural uranium as a fuel and heavy water as the moderator.

Management of utilities and industry without major commitments until operating and testing the operation of an experimental plant at Robitson, Ont., and a start had been made on Canada's first large-scale power station at Douglas Point, Ont. SYSTEM ESTABLISHED

"Now that NDP (code name for the Robitson plant) has operated successfully for about a year and Douglas Point concept offers the lowest cost power for larger plants, the technical and economic feasibility has been established."

"Canadian industry can see important cost reductions from large-scale production of components and systems."

The heavy-water power reactor concept offers the lowest cost power in many areas of the world. This most countries with a capacity for electrical demand now can begin, with confidence, to plan power plants with capacity offered by the Canadian heavy-water power reactor concept."
