## Roblin Goes After Fish Following Election Win

WINNIPEG (CP) — Premier Roblin went fishing Friday with his Progressive Conservative cabinet members in the record vote which returned 30 Progressive Conservatives, 14 Liberals, 11 New Democrats and one Social Credit member to the 57-seat house.

to improve his over-all majority after appointment of a Speaker. The result was a paradox of sentiment.

"I'll worry about the affairs of state after I've caught some fish," he said after the election. His majority was cut in the record vote which returned 30 Progressive Conservatives, 14 Liberals, 11 New Democrats and one Social Credit member to the 57-seat house.

"We had hoped to make greater gains," he said of the Liberal party—but judged the result a rejection of the Roblin administration.

Attention now turns to the northern riding of Churchill where voting was deferred to July 7. A Conservative and NDP candidate will battle it out and Mr. Roblin needs the seat.

Its strength was in the Greater Winnipeg area where NDP candidates took Kildonan and Wellington from the Conservatives and Burrows from the Liberals.

At prorogation the standing was 36 Conservatives, 13 Liberals, five NDP, one Social Credit and two vacancies.

Municipal Affairs Minister Robert Smellie lost his rubber match with Liberal Rod Clements in Birtle-Russell.
