

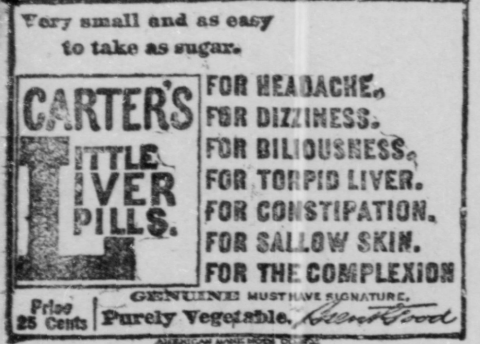

TRIBUTE TO DR. McLEOD.

We cannot attempt, today, to give even an idea of the wit, learning and eloquence displayed in the speeches delivered, last evening, at the dinner given by the Caledonian Club in honor of St. Andrew. But we must not neglect a short reference to the thoughtful, kindly, timely and in every way creditable remarks of Dr. Taylor concerning his afflicted fellow-physician, Dr. McLeod. In the course of his speech, when responding to the toast to the Medical Profession, Dr. Taylor paid a high tribute to Dr. McLeod's skill and unselfish devotion to duty, declaring that he had never met a cleverer or warmer-hearted man. He also referred to Dr. McLeod's public spirit as evidenced in the Doctor's powerful and successful advocacy of waterworks and sewerage for Charlottetown. The citizens of Charlottetown rejoice in the excellent sanitary conditions and in the possession of all the modern conveniences resulting from waterworks and sewerage; and we are, in this regard, as Dr. Taylor truly declared, more deeply indebted to Dr. McLeod than to any other man. We have the greater pleasure in registering and publishing this expressed opinion of Dr. Taylor because we feel sure that it will cheer Dr. McLeod, as he lies upon his bed of sickness, to learn that his labors are appreciated, and because we know that it will be fully endorsed by his fellow-citizens.
