**Some Minor Official Changes.**

OTTAWA, June 3.—The Canadian Pacific Railway has been notified that at the end of the current fiscal year the arrangement under which the C. P. R. use the Intercolonial railway between St. John and Halifax will be cancelled. The parties will then make a new agreement.

 The last Cabinet Council before the holidays will be held on Wednesday.  
 Mgr. Del Val will sail for Rome about the middle of this month.  
 John Nickerson, harbor master at Port LaTour, Nova Scotia, has been discharged for political partizanship.  
 Henry Dunlap has been appointed keeper of the lighthouse on Bird Island, vice Angus Campbell dismissed for political partizanship.  
 Captain Neil Townsend, of Louisburg, has been appointed Port Warden at Louisburg, vice Alexander McQuibb, whose services are dispensed with.

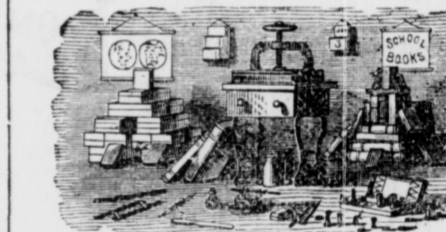
**THE RIOTS IN CALCUTTA.**

**MUSSELMEN AND HINDOOS DISTURBED.**

**Great Anxiety in London.**

CALCUTTA, July 3.—Serious riots among Musselmen occurred here on Thursday evening. The city's gang of rioters paraded the streets, hooting and stoning the Europeans, several of whom were injured. Finally the authorities were compelled to call out the troops. It is regarded as significant that the Hindoos passively sympathise with the rioters. The situation is still grave and an additional force of cavalry was required to disperse
