## Makes Plea For Improved Spoken French In Canada

CHICOUTIMI, Que. (CP) — State Secretary Courtemanche called Wednesday night for efforts to improve the standard of French spoken in Canada.

He said incorrect speech is a sign of "intellectual weakness." Those who recoiled from learning to speak properly were defeatists, guilty of mental laziness.

The minister spoke at the annual convention of l'Association Canadienne des Educateurs de Langue Francaise.

The statements were included in a text of a speech issued to the press before delivery.

"I do not believe that a French-Canadian language can be entirely created on the pattern of the French language," the minister said.

**ONLY TWO KINDS**

There can be only two kinds of French language: well-spoken and poorly-spoken French.

Those who want to make a language that is peculiarly our own would lead us of necessity to one that is poorly spoken.

Popular language, sometimes had a rich flavor. Mr. Courtemanche cited the charm of words like "brunante" for twilight and "poudrierie" for powdered snow, terms unknown in France.

Such words would certainly have fascinated Moliere, the celebrated 17th century French dramatist. But it was "false" to say the lead in language must come from the people.

"Grammar and style do not fall within the province of the people, but of the specialists and technicians."

**SHOULD KEEP CHARM**

The special characteristics of French-Canadian language should be retained. French spoken by Belgians, Swiss or those from the south of France had its special charm.

"Our French, too, has its charm, a fact which is borne out by many Europeans."

The French we find here is an authentic French, without pretension; but it is in perpetual danger of corruption.

Mr. Courtemanche said he is puzzled by those who feel there is any doubt about French survival in North America. Such people were "pseudo-intellectuals" dwelling on a theme that had lost point.

"The struggles of the past are more and more losing their reality."

**NATION'S GROWTH RAPID**

The development of Canada had been rapid and the birth of national consciousness sudden. It was unrealistic to expect all Canadians, whether they spoke English or French, to master their mother tongue to the same degree.

But the elite must possess that mastery, to preserve the language and transmit it "in all its purity" to future generations.

GROTON, Conn. (AP) — The biggest submarine known, and the first to be powered by two atomic engines, takes to the water today.

The 5,900-ton Triton, about twice the size of present U.S. submarines, will go down the way of the electric boat division of General Dynamics Corporation.

Designed as a radar patrol vessel, the 447-foot Triton cost about \$100,000,000.

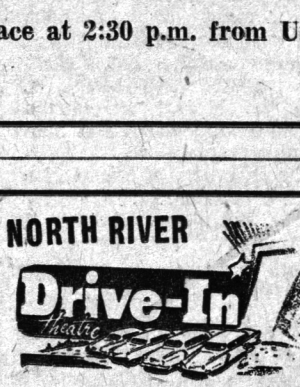
