SAIGON (AP) - Distasteful to many among many devout Buddhists with the leadership of their faith...
'Vetinane Buddhism is falling into the hands of self-interested politicians and the Viet Cong itself,' one Buddhist said...

Correspondents in recent weeks have found many of the monks prominent in the 1963 anti-Buddhist riots...

Among them is Thich Duc Nghiep, a young monk who served as spokesman for the Buddhists then. Duc Nghiep is studying at Columbia University in New York, told this correspondent last week...
'I am strongly against all demonstrations in Saigon now. Whatever the reason, they can only sap the central government and make Viet Nam unmanageable.'

He has advocated the organization of mobile teams of Buddhist monks to tour the countryside to speak out against the Viet Cong. But this has not been done. We Buddhist refugees...
