

# GOVERNMENT DECIDES TO QUIT ROLE OF SUGAR DADDY

OTTAWA (CP)—The government has decided to quit its role as a sort of "sugar daddy" to about 200 girls in the capital.

It has told them to pack their bags and move out of Laurentian Terrace Hotel by Oct. 1. The place is being closed.

The hotel has lost money for the last five years, and the taxpayers have been footing the deficit. The 1963 loss was \$67,000 and one of \$80,000 is forecast this year.

Most of the girls, under 25, are junior civil servants, nurses, university students, or embassy employees.

The hotel was opened in 1942 when there was a war time shortage of accommodation for a rapidly growing civil service. Since then more than 10,000 girls have stayed there.

In 1962 the Glasco royal commission on government organization said the hotel should be closed.

Since 1958 the girls have been paying \$60.50 for a single room and \$53.50 for a double. Both rates include meals. But if that was cheap, the girls didn't exactly rush to Vacancies have been increasing since 1960. Last Jan. 1 the house-keeping staff showed only 207 out of a possible 368 tenants.

# Businessmen Rapped Again Over Poor Exports Showing

MONTREAL (AP)—Canadian businessmen were rapped again Tuesday because they don't export enough.

Two speakers at the annual meeting of the Canadian Exporters' Association had some sharp words for the 1,200 delegates, many representing firms taking part in export programs. J. Gordon McMillen, president of Keenetic Products Ltd. of Brantford, Ont., told the meeting there is only one way Canada's secondary export market can experience the growth it needs—by exporting.

"I think it is obvious that as yet we are not exporting as a poor job on Canadian products of secondary industry," he said.

"That we will find world markets is even more obvious. Proportions for our raw materials have no doubt, but the plus where I fear we shall falter and falter badly—is in the progress and expansion of our secondary industry."

LESS PROTECTION GIVEN  
Current trade talks at Geneva were a forerunner of shrinking tariff protection. Only the Canadian firms that had built up their economic strength and productive capacity through export markets would be able to meet successfully the resulting international competition.

Vernon O. Marquez, executive vice-president of Northern Electric Co. Ltd. of Montreal, said the meeting Canada's secondary manufacturers "have not been conspicuous by their aggressiveness in seeking export markets."

"I suspect that a good deal of the talk we hear about Canadian manufacturing is a desire to complete in overseas markets with low wages, rate countries. It is something that is an over simplification, if not sometimes an outright alibi," he said.

Another group took a long range look at the economic prospects in the field of capital and non-durable goods and capital spending.

The consensus was that, with the upcoming entry into the consumer market of Canada's large teen-age population, everything should be bright.

There were problems on the horizon, however, such as being to ensure that Canada's economy expanded enough to provide jobs for the expected 150,000 young men and women who would be entering the
