GREAT BRITAIN IN THE FOG.

Business Impeded—Accidents Frequent.

LONDON, Nov. 26.—A heavy fog has fallen like a pall over England. Accidents of more or less importance have occurred in many places.

At Portsmouth the fog is so dense that the trials of the new warships have been rendered impossible for the present.

LATEST NEWS BY WIRE AND MAIL

HAVANA, Nov. 23.—Official despatches from Matanzas announced the release of Senora DaRoca, mother of the insurgent leader, Jose DeRoca, and several other prominent people who have been imprisoned there for some time past. A fire yesterday destroyed eight houses, two drug stores and the post office and telegraph offices at Corallillo, province of Santa Clara. General Pando has arrived at Matanzas. He has visited the hospitals here and has ordered the distribution of 10,000 rations of food daily, to the "re-concentrated" people.

LONDON, Nov. 24.—The Rome correspondent of the Daily Chronicle says: "The report is confirmed that the powers have decided to blockade Constantinople in case Turkey refuses to withdraw her troops from Crete and to accept a proposition from the governor of the island."

BARCELONA, Nov. 23.—General Weyler, the former Captain-General of Cuba, arrived here this morning, on board the Spanish steamer Montsurrat, from Havana, via Gibara, Porto Rico and Corunna. The General landed beneath the Columbus monument, at 10 a.m., and was acclaimed by about 20,000 people. In order to escape the manifestants the general was driven to the house of Deputy Saladrigas, where, however, he was forced to appear on the balcony, and was applauded by the crowds who had gathered at the house.

MADRID, Nov. 23.—A Catalan delegation had an hour's conference yesterday

with the minister for the colonies, Senor Morel, during which they protested against the Cuban tariff being made autonomous. The minister replied that he had fully considered the general interests of the colonies, and was convinced that his policy would lead to a peaceful solution. He explained that in dealing with the colonies, national and not merely certain industrial interests must be considered. Senor Morel announced his intention to maintain his opinions before the cabinet, and his colleagues disagreed with him, and were prepared to resign.

QUEBEC, Nov. 23.—It is learned that Mr Marchand will ask legislation empowering amounts to two million dollars for the province during the session of the legislature, which was opened today. Jules Tessier was chosen speaker. The speech from the throne foreshadowed reforms in school legislation and the appointment of a minister of education.

MONTREAL, Nov. 23.—R. Dandurand will be fully expected here to be called to the senate soon, in succession to the late Senator Becharard district of St. John and Iperville. Dandurand is a son-in-law of Premier Marchand.

TORONTO, Nov. 23.—The Evening Telegram's London cable says that it is more than probable that Lord Strathbrooke will be commander of the British artillery team, proposed to be sent to Canada next year to compete with the batteries of the Dominion.
