Former Senate Leader For Conservatives Dies

MONTREAL, Oct. 19 (CP) — Senator Charles Colquhoun Ballantyne, 83, former Progressive-Conservative Party leader in the Senate, died tonight after a lengthy illness.

He was appointed to the Senate in 1932 after many years as a Conservative member of Parliament. He was elected to the House of Commons in 1917 for Montreal St. George, and served as Minister of Marine and Fisheries in the 1917 Borden Government.

Senator Ballantyne was born in Colquhoun, Ont. A prominent businessman, he was director of several companies and was chairman of the Canadian Investment Fund, Ltd.

Senator Ballantyne is survived by his widow, the former Ethel Maude Trenholme of Montreal, and three sons, Charles T. James R., and Murray G. Ballantyne, all of Montreal.

Destroyer Sioux Claims Record As Mine Killer

WITH THE CANADIAN DESTROYERS OFF KOREA, Oct. 19 (CP) — The Canadian destroyer Sioux is laying claim to the unofficial title of champion mine killer of the United Nations destroyer fleet.

The Sioux, commanded by Cmdr. Paul D. Taylor of Victoria, has knocked off eight mines in recent weeks, four during the Inchon invasion period and another four in the last few days.

Last Thursday, she spotted and exploded two floating mines with 40-mm. gunfire while on patrol off Fankoch Point on the Ongjin Peninsula, just south of the 38th parallel. Later, operating further north, she blasted two more mines.

This swing in the trade balance was caused mainly by a sharp decline in exports to Commonwealth countries and sharp increase in imports.

In trade with the United States, Canada reduced the traditional deficit balance with that country to \$90,000,000 for the eight months from \$399,100,000 last year.
