and said that in his 9 years on the Bench it was the first ever which he had presided. He congratulated counsel for not having taken "frivolous" objections and hampering proceedings.

Both counsel, Mr. J. O. C. Campbell, Q. C. for the Crown, and Mr. R. R. Bell, Q. C. for the defendant, made relatively short summations as they addressed the jury when the trial came to a sudden ending as Mr. Bell announced he would put no witnesses on the stand.

Case For Crown. Mr. Campbell said that in opening the case for the Crown he had not referred to any statements made to police by the accused. He said he knew there would be objections from the defence if he did as it had become a rule of practice rather than a rule of law not to do this. He noted that the names of several people who were connected with the events of the night of June 1 had been heard and said the jury might wonder why they were not called by the Crown to testify. This he stated was because he felt there was no real need for bringing to the witness stand relatives of the accused who might later feel that perhaps some remarks of theirs might be responsible for him being declared guilty. In any event he did not think purely family matters should be brought into the court.

He told the members that if the Court had erred in permitting the admission of certain statements then it was not a matter for the jury to consider but for another court. He also said that in addition to these statements the jury were to give equal weight to all others made by witnesses. He
