MISSING LINKS.

Two centuries have increased England's wealth forty fold. There are about 1,300 theatres in Europe. Italy possesses most. A sister of the late Mr. Spurgeon recently presented in London. Geography as a science was introduced to Europe by the Moors in 1294. A certain forest plant in Japan grows to be about six feet high in three weeks. Female bookbinders are reported to be multiplying in Paris and other French cities. Jerusalem has 135 places where liquor is sold, the license fees going to the tax collector.

Australia has more places of public worship in proportion to population than any other country. Some Chinese and many Africans use the ear as a pocket to carry coins and other small articles. Frequent cutting or trimming of the hair increases its thickness, but not their number. Of 1,000 men who marry, 332 marry younger women, 571 marry women of the same age, and eighty-nine marry older women. An amateur oculist in Michigan made a glass eye for his spaniel dog. The animal soon became used to the artificial member. The fish of forest rats is esteemed a culinary delicacy in parts of Cuba. Their main articles of diet are Brazil nuts, which imparts a good flavor to them.

Wilmington has the Old Swedes Church, founded in 1808. It has a Bible given by Queen Anne and common union service contributed by Swedish ministers. A peculiar disease of the will is more common in the Kingdom of the Netherlands. The sufferer is unable to cross any open space like the city square. The case of old Boston is now given up to the poorest residents in the city. Fashionable Boston is built on the Back Bay land made by filling up the harbor. Salt Lake City is one of the most beautiful in the United States. It was laid out when land was worthless, the streets are wide and each has a rivulet running through it. St. Louis is the greatest mule market in the world. The mules that transport the baggage of the British army during the last Egyptian war were bought in St. Louis. It is said that only Mecca, in Arabia, and Thessalonica, in Thessaly, are now closed to Christian pilgrims, but 100 years ago nearly the whole world outside of Europe and America was shut.

It is stated by authorities entitled to credit that the two-fifths of the entire area of the United States consists of arid land, and that upon 616,000,000 acres of this land crops could be raised if water were supplied. Over fifty kinds of bark are now used in the manufacture of paper. Even banana skins, pine vines, coconut fibers, hay, straw, water weeds, leaves, shavings, corn husks and hop plants are used for the same purpose. Shanghai boasts of the largest mission press in the world. In connection with it is a type foundry, where electrotyping and stereotyping are also done. The press has fonts for printing in many languages and every year sends out more than 35,000,000 pages. The number of foreign residents in Spain is small, numbering only about 25,000. The emigration from Spain has been in some years as high as 125,000. Four-fifths of the emigrants settle in Spanish America and the remainder in the Spanish African possessions. The Maharajah of Kutch, Behar, the most popular prince of India, is visiting in London and is receiving a great deal of attention. His full title is Lieut. Colonel H. H. Sir Nirpendra Narain, Bahadur of Kutch Behar, G. C. J. E. Hon. A. S. C. to H. R. H. the Prince of Wales.

The pineal gland is a small body almost in the center of the brain. It contains a cavity holding a sandy substance composed of phosphate and carbonate of lime. Its use in the animal economy is absolutely unknown. Fanciful physiologists have conjectured it to be the seat of the soul. Instances are numerous of persons who, born without arms, learned to use their feet as hands. Bulwer, in "The Artificial Changeling," tells of John Simonds, a native of Berkshire, who was born armless, but who could write with his mouth, thread a needle with his toe, tie a knot, play cards and do almost anything else that another person usually does with his fingers. The apparatus for keeping the eye moist is complex and efficient. It comprises the lacrimal gland, which secretes the tears; the tear ducts, which convey the tears into the eye; the lacrimal ducts, which convey the tears into the nose; and the lacrimal sac, a dilatation of the canal.

Bearded women have been very numerous. The most noted of the number was the famous Margaret of Austria, appointed by Charles V. to be governor of the Netherlands. She had a long, stiff black beard and, conceiving the idea that it added to the majesty of her appearance, was very careful of it, and so combed and trained it as to make it seem much greater than it was. Baltimore will celebrate the centenary of her incorporation as a city in 1847 by a "centennial exposition," which promises to be greater than any ever held in this country, excepting, of course, the world's fairs at Philadelphia and Chicago. While the exposition of 1897 will be international in scope, it is intended also to supplement the work of the southern exposition at Atlanta by making the display of southern products and southern manufactures at Baltimore the most comprehensive ever gathered in one place.

The most remarkable instance of rapid growth was recorded by the French Academy in 1729. It was a boy of 6 years of age, 5 feet 6 inches in height. At the age of 5 his voice changed, at 6 his beard had grown, and he appeared a man of 30. He had a great physical strength, and could easily lift to his shoulders and carry bags of grain that weighed 20 pounds. His decline was as rapid as his growth. At 8 his hair and beard were gray; at 10 he tottered in his walk, his teeth fell out, and his hands became palsied; at 12 he died with every outward sign of extreme old age.

A thirty-page book, printed and bound in sheep, has been filed for record at the office of the Registrar of the County of New York, in favor of the Loan & Trust Co. of New York, and the Southern Pacific. The amount is made payable in gold, the bonds being for \$1,000 each, due April 1, 1912.

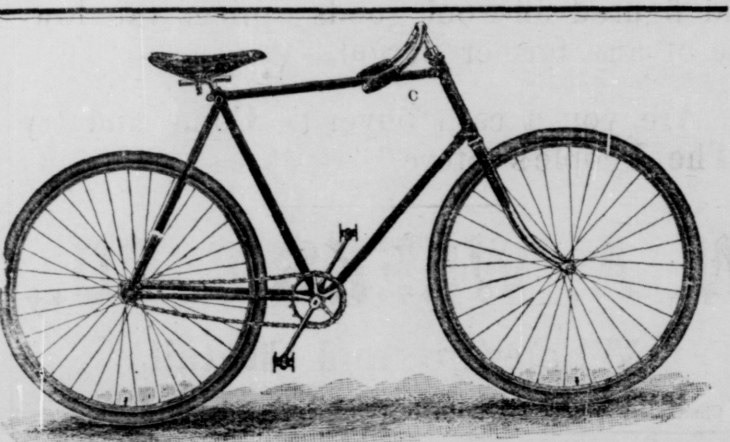
