Official Opening Tuesday Of Montague High School



Shown above is the new Montague High School, the official opening of which takes place on Tuesday, December 1st.

Commenced on August 23, 1952, the building was completed on Feb. 7th, 1953. Mr. William White-way, general contractor, erected the building in record time so that students were able to have classes during the second half of the year. The school, which is 111 feet by 54 feet, is of a six classroom design. In the center of the building is a T corridor. On the top of the T are two classrooms, and a similar number on each side of the T. The average size of each room is approximately 30 feet by 22 feet, each room containing a coat locker, teacher's locker, and bookcase. Day lighting is provided by five large windows in each room, and night lighting by fluorescent.

The six rooms have been completed in usual board with pressed-wood and wainscoting. The floors are covered with inlaid congoletum. Each room has been painted a different color, the work being done by Mr. James Larkin. Completed also is the heating and plumbing by MacLeod & Greene, and the wiring by Gilbert Clements.

The basement includes a furnace room, laboratory, storage room, lavatories and an auditorium, 90 feet by 30 feet, with dressing rooms to be provided at the stage which will be placed at one end. The building is heated by hot water from an oil-burning furnace. The completed school presents a fine exterior appearance, finished in Inlustrone, and is considered to be an attractive addition to the town, as well as providing more accommodation for the large number of students attending Montague school.
