MORNING POST CAUSTIC

LONDON, May 26.—"If we scrapped our fleet to the bone, Canada and Australia would cut theirs to the quick," says the Morning Post's naval correspondent, who, in the course of a long article in the Post, suggests reconsideration of the whole question of Imperial naval defence, based on the principle of a "central striking force of the maximum mobility." Regarding Australia, he asserts that any form of serious Progressive sea-training is out of the question with an attenuated naval unit like that proposed.

The action in Canada is still more drastic, the Post's naval correspondent says. "Here there is no longer any attempt to maintain even the smallest active naval units," he states. "Economy is being carried to the uttermost limits short of entire non-participation in naval defence."

MANY COCKFIGHTERS ARE SENTENCED

MONTREAL, May 25.—One month in jail, \$50 costs or a further month's imprisonment, was the sentence allotted Fred Picher, who said he was a United States citizen, who was charged in the police court before Recorder Semple this morning with conducting a cocking main. "Cock fighting is the most debasing, cruel and useless spot I know of," said the magistrate after announcing the sentence. Fifty-two men found in the main were fined \$25, or a month in jail.

URGES A CLOSER UNION BETWEEN U. S. AND CANADA

NEW YORK, May 25.—Declaring that the United States and Canada "constitute the greatest geographical union of English speaking people in the world," the executive council of the American Bankers' Association in a declaration of principles on business and legislative conditions, favors a closer community of interest between these two countries.

"We declare," the statement said, "our faith in the value of a closer community of interest between the United States and our great neighbor, Canada. These two countries constitute the greatest geographical union of English-speaking people in the world. There is a natural unity of purpose, unity of political ideals and unity of business interests between the two that should be emphasized rather than obscured by the border line between them. We bespeak from American business, American banking and American public development of friendship between the two."

A NEW KIND OF DISH-PAN.

IRISH LEADERS IN LONDON

DUBLIN, May 27.—Mr. Michael Collins, head of the Irish Provisional Government, left for London last night. He was accompanied by Mr. William Cosgrove, Minister of the Local Government in the Dail Eireann Cabinet, and Mr. John O'Hagarty, Secretary to the Provisional Government.

It is supposed here that the main subject of today's discussion in London was the text of the Free State constitution, which Mr. Arthur Griffith, Dail president, took with him. This constitution must conform strictly to the terms of the Anglo-Irish treaty, and has been drafted with that object. If the British Ministers are satisfied with it, and learn that it will be submitted to the Irish people, it is considered unlikely they will enter the pact with De Valera. The view here among the Sinn Feiners in both wings is that the pact recently arrived at between Mr. Collins and Mr. DeValera was a primarily domestic matter, designed to keep solid for the longest possible time

all comrades in the Sinn Fein party lest control pass to other sections of the Irish, whose opinion was identified in the past with the moderate policy. In Provisional Government circles there is no breach with the British contemplated.

INTOXICATED COW LEADS TO A BOOZE STILL NEAR PICTOU

PICTOU, May 26.—A cow that became separated from the herd of a farmer in the Central Carriboo district last night wandered afield and when she failed to return with the rest of the herd was found later inebriated and crazed with moonshine. The condition of the cow led to an investigation this morning by farmers of the district with the result that a complete moonshine outfit, still and all, was discovered in the woods hidden by the thicket and located by a stream.

Chief of Police Morrison, Pictou, motored to Central Carriboo. He was given the location of the illicit plant and succeeded in capturing the owner and the complete plant, mash and several bottles of manufactured liquor. The outfit was confiscated and taken to the custom house and the owner locked up pending a preliminary hearing tomorrow morning. The owner of the plant blamed his downfall on the inquisitiveness of the farmer's wandering cow, stating that the cow had practically cleaned him out of a part barrel of mash which resulted in her acquiring her "jag" and the discovery of his plant.

40 Divers, 280 Feet Under Water Will Seek To Salvage Lusitania

LONDON, May 26.—Count Zanardi Landi head of the Ayeredy Salvage Syndicate expects to begin his attempt to raise the Lusitania's cargo next month, the date depending upon the cessation of the National Engineers' strike. Landi spent many years in Canada and raised a number of ship in the Pacific and elsewhere. He is now in London in the possession of a salvage contract with underwriters whereby his syndicate will take 80 per cent. of the value of whatever is raised from the Lusitania.

Landi has already received bids for the film rights of the expedition. He says he is satisfied there is enough bullion, jewels and furs

in wreck to make operations commercially sound.

In order to remove the valuable from the ship and make the bulk buoyant he will employ forty divers wearing special suits which will enable them to work 280 feet beneath the surface of the water, which is the depth of the Lusitania's keel.

Landi is finding that few experts agree with him that it is possible to salvage the liner. Captain Besse third officer aboard when the ship was torpedoed says the operation is commercially and technically impossible. "The specie room was practically empty" he said. "The cargo was of no special value. Even if the vessel after being submerged seven years is not now covered with sand, she was probably broken in two by enormous impact with which the bows must have struck bottom. Certainly every rivet was strained and the boilers probably tumbled into the bows."

REICHSTAG TO RESUME

BERLIN, May 26.—With the return of Chancellor Wirth and foreign Minister Rathenau from the Genoa conference, the Reichstag will resume this week its discussion of Germany's international relations and give final sanction to the Imperial budget and some uncompleted tax legislation.

Parliamentary circles do not anticipate any now or startling revelations from the Chancellor in connection with the deliberations at Genoa, and for the present interest centres wholly in the debate over the treaty signed with the Russians at Rapallo. Prompt ratification of the pact is viewed as a foregone conclusion as it has received pronounced advance approval from all parties.

The Genoa conference as a whole continues to provoke only listless interest among the Reichstag leaders.
