I was put on a high protein diet, taken off starch, sugar, coffee and alcohol. This, in conjunction with prescription therapy (Vitamin B injections, adrenal cortical extract, estrogen, beller-gal, calcium, etc.) turned the tide completely.

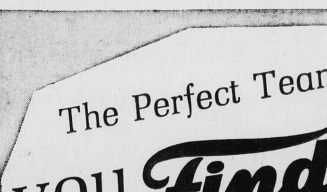
