

SENATE MAKES *the big* DECISIONS! PROGRAM CIMN

Reports from two academic committees proved to be the highlight of last week's Senate meeting. The examinations and evaluations committee brought the matter of letter grades to be the subject of discussion before Senate. The committee will make a further recommendation on the motion regarding correlation of numerical or letter grades which are to be placed on a student's transcrip. At a later meeting of Senate. The academic planning committee gave its report to senate. The home economics department has minor changes. In that the course description for Home Ec. 101 has been reworded to provide a clearer indication of actual course content. The Senate approved a new course in the Dept. of Classics. The course is entitled Classics 202, the Greek World from 431 to 300 B.C. The pre-requisite for the course will be

classics 201. The sociology Dept. suggested changes in description of Courses 201, 301, 372, 452, 242, 341, and 421. In a letter to Dr. Ozmon, Dean of Arts, Dr. Dasgupta Chariman of the Sociology and Anthropology Deptments seemed that the description were necessary due to the course descriptions being written 5 or 6 years age, by Professors who were not with the Dept. now. Sociology 252 will be changed in course number and description to 311, while Anthropology 412 shall be changed to 383, entitled Folklore and Cultural Character. Although, changed in both number and description these courses shall remain basically same. Sociology 272 crosslisting with Anthropology 401 will be changed to Soc. 371 cross listing with Anthropology 371 Sociology majors out of the six electives to be taken three will be required from the 300 or 400 level. The Dept. of Ec. will offer two new courses Ec. III, and II2, these courses will be entitled Introduction to Food and Fibre Ec. The Political Science Dept. will offer courses 391, 392, and 401, 402

in the next year. The Senate defeated the motion that Business Administration 201-202, and 301-302 be changed to two one full year courses 200 and 300 respectively the reason this was defeated was that the University of P.E.I. were trying to keep a semesterized system. The Chairman of Senate Pres. R, Baker although not present at the Senate Meeting, had a motion of reconsideration to be passed. Mr Baker's recommendation was that for reconsideration of a motion within a twelve month period, Senate would have to have the approval of twenty members present. In a 24 Calendar month period, 18 members, and 16 members in a 36 month period. It was noted that this recommendation tied the hands of Senate somewhat in that there were only 25 members of Senate who actually were active, or attended the Meetings. The motion was therefore amended, to having 18, 16, and 14 members present in the same period of time for approval of a motion of reconsideration. The amendment was approved. The next Meeting of Senate shall be Feb.3/77.
