"LOOKING INTO PEOPLE"

who settled there two to three centuries ago. They were found to be generally vigorous and healthy but their inbreeding showed in abnormally high incidence of deaf-mutism and inherited teeth defects."

"And not because they are more quarrelsome, but because wives, usually younger, have more surviving relatives. One study showed, "among husbands in their fifties almost half had a surviving mother-in-law, whereas only 35% of the wives had one. College students report twice as many grandmas living as grandpas."

**Forgotten Woes:** The tendency to repress or forget unpleasant experiences is borne out by studies made of thirty and seventy year old men and women. "While both groups considered childhood the most carefree and rewarding years, older people had the roughest view of childhood."
