### NOTES AND COMMENTS.

The Crimean war cost Great Britain £77,000,000, of which £33,000,000 was an addition to the permanent national debt. More than twenty thousand British soldiers perished in it mostly from sickness and exposure. The only result of it was to keep Russia out of Constantinople. It did not permanently settle the Eastern question, and did not even prevent the restoration of Sebastopol as a naval stronghold. If we understand the words of British statesmen the South African war, if successful, will be productive of far better results.

### Local and Other Items.

**CITY TAXES.**—The defaulters list for City Taxes is now ready for publication, requested to pay up and have name taken off the list.

**NEW BAPTIST CHURCH.**—The new Baptist church at Windsor, which cost about \$14,000, was opened on Sunday, two years and two months after the destruction of the former structure. The organ in the new church cost about \$2,000.

**THE WAR JUSTIFIABLE.**—Rev. Canon Brock preached in St. Luke's Church, Halifax, on Sunday night, discussing the question, "On what intelligible ground can the Britons war against the Boers be justified?" Canon Brock, in an eloquent address, justified England's action in this matter on every ground, answering a number of objections that have been made. Britain, in his opinion, could not have done other than she did on moral grounds or with regard to national honor.

**A PAINFUL SIGHT.**—From Shakespeare Cliff, Dover, G. B., for a wager, two men started to swim round the buoy, about a quarter of a mile from the shore. When near the buoy one of the competitors was seized with cramp. His opponent went to his rescue but the disabled man gripped the other around the neck. After a struggle the friend broke away and secured the drowning man in the prescribed manner, but becoming exhausted after a time, and no assistance being near, he had to allow his companion to sink. The painful scene was witnessed by an excited crowd on the shore.

**NEWFOUNDLAND POLITICS.**—A S. John's despatch says: Hon. A. B. Morin, minister of marine and fisheries, has resigned owing to differences with the government as to acts done and as to future policy of administration. Besides he alleges financial loss to himself by remaining longer in the government. The resignation will undoubtedly cause a crisis as there are two departmental vacancies now. It is believed the governor will refuse to allow any more acting appointments. The government would likely be defeated if they sent any one for re-election to Morin's office, and Bond will likely be premier within a few weeks.

**FUNERAL BY TELEPHONE.**—A funeral by telephone is alleged to have taken place in Somerset county, Maine. A citizen of Eustis died and his family desired that Elder Jacquith, of Emblem, officiated, as he was an old schoolmate of the deceased. Owing to bad roads the clergyman was unable to reach the place, he being unable to get further than North New Portland. But the superintendent of the telephone line which connects with the Dead River region happened to be a guest at the North New Portland Hotel and he came to the rescue; called up the Fustic station, ordered an instrument transferred to the house where the funeral was held, and while the clergyman spoke into the 'phone, a good deacon transferred his words from the instrument to the people assembled at the house of mourning, thirty-eight miles away.
