

Boxers' Pub Will Soon Be Closed

WINDSOR, England (CP)—The Star and Garter at Windsor, one of Britain's most famous pubs, may close about the end of the year. The pub has a world-wide fame for its connections with great boxers and is a landmark known to hundreds of Canadian tourists who have visited Windsor Castle. The 100-year-old establishment is situated only a few yards from the castle.

Since 1919, The Star and Garter, which has an adjoining gymnasium, has been a favorite training place for such boxers as former world heavyweight champion Primo Carnera, Jack Doyle, Len Harvey and Sugar Ray Robinson. The owners say negotiations are under way to sell the premises to a company seeking the site for a building project.

NEW YORK (AP)—Profit-taking made a hash of plus and minus signs of a vigorous stock market advance Wednesday in the heaviest trading of the year.

Among leading issues the gains and losses generally ran to around three points or so. Wide gyrations of individual stocks marked the day.

The Associated Press average of 30 stocks rose 60 cents to \$150.80.

On the American Stock Exchange losers included British American Oil.

Rising Canadian stocks included Dome Mines, up 1/4 on sales of 2,600 shares. Down were Hudson Bay Mining, off 1 1/4 on 5,500 shares. International Nickel two, Aluminium Ltd. 1/8, McIntyre 1/4 and Granby Mining 1/8.

Upside Canadian issues on the American Exchange included Shaganigan, ahead one on 20,000 shares. Fargo Oil 1-16 and Richwell Petroleum 1-16. Lower were Scurry-Rainbow Oil, down 1/4 on 7,200 shares. Preston East Dome 1/8, Brazilian Traction 1/8, Jupiter Oil 1-16 and Molybdenite of Canada 1-16.
