A writer in the Industrial Review offers a new solution of the Irish problem. He wants through traffic from America to Britain diverted so as to cross the Emerald Isle on its way, and he thinks the thought and labor necessary to carry out the scheme, and the stream of life which it would send across Ireland, would keep the turbulent Celts so busy that agitation would die an atural death. In order to make this plan possible the writer outlines his "short route" from America to Britain. This involves the construction of a railway from Quebec to St. John's N. E., with a tunnel under the Straits of Belle Isle, fast steamers on the ocean route, and a tunnel under the North channel, between England and Ireland. The difficulty of carrying out these works, the writer admits in a bluff and breezy way, but it is quite evident that he thinks this point hardly worthy the consideration of Americans, because great enterprises "are here matters of common newspaper talk."

No doubt the matter is very simple, and only requires money; but we would advise the British Government not to relieve itself at once of all care in connection with the Irish problem, because there may be some causes of delay which will prevent this "common newspaper talk" from being suddenly transformed into actually constructed works.
