IN MEMORIAM

MRS. KATHERINE FARMER

The death of Mrs. Katherine Farmer, widow of the late Patrick Farmer occurred at the home of her daughter Mrs. Frank Dorsey, Borden on Tuesday, September, 19th.

Mrs. Farmer, formerly Katherine Greenan, was born at Newton in 1872 where she lived until her marriage to Patrick Farmer when she moved to Kinkora. Here she spent the greater part of her life. When her husband predeceased her in 1926 she went to spend a few years at Boston, Mass. After returning to her native parish she suffered a severe illness which necessitated the amputation of her leg and in 1943 she came to Borden to make her home with her daughter Mrs. Frank Dorsey who cared for her with filial love and devotion.

Mrs. Farmer lived the exemplary life of a fine Christian woman being an affectionate wife, devoted mother and a hospitable neighbour, ever ready to help every good cause. Zealous in church work, she was faithful in attending church services while she was able. During her later years when she was confined to a wheel chair, she was visited frequently by Rev. Fr. MacDonald and Rev. Fr. Cass, and died as she had lived fortified by the last holy rites of the Catholic Church.

Beneficial floral tributes, Mass cards and messages of sympathy were silent tokens of love and esteem in which the deceased was held.

She leaves to mourn her loss four daughters and two sons: Katherine, Mrs. J. E. Powers of Hyde Park, Mass; Edna, Mrs. A.A.
